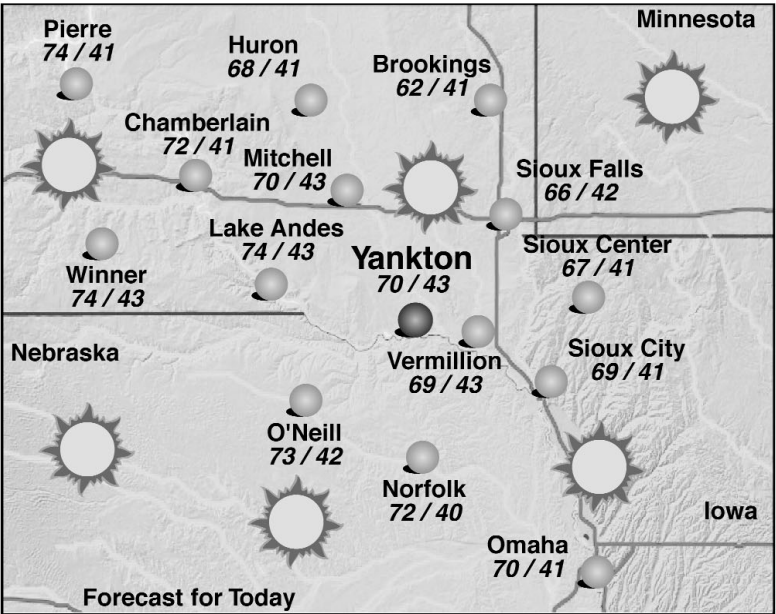

VERMILLION — For the sixth year, the University of South Dakota was recognized nationally for outstanding community service by the Corporation for National and Community Service, which named USD to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll.

USD is one of 766 colleges and universities recognized for instituting an exemplary service-learning program on campus.

The honor is a reflection of the hard work and dedication from students, faculty and staff members who have made service a priority at USD, according to the Center for Academic & Global Engagement.

USD is one of six institutions from South Dakota on this year's honor roll. The Honor Roll recognizes higher education institutions that reflect the values of exemplary community service and achieve meaningful outcomes in their communities.

USD's selection to the Honor Roll is recognition from the highest levels of the federal government for the university's commitment to service and civic engagement. In the past year, more than 2,300 USD students contributed more than 90,000

hours of service in a variety of curricular and co-curricular activities, including service-learning through academic programs of study, First-Year Experience and individual courses, and through institutional programs like Alternative Week of Off-campus Learning (AWOL) and AmeriCorps VISTA.

The President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll, launched in 2006, annually recognizes institutions of higher education for their commitment to and achievement in community service. The President's Honor Roll increases the public's awareness of the contributions that colleges and their students make to local communities and the nation as a whole. Honorees for the various award levels were selected based on a series of factors, including scope and innovation of service projects, percentage of student participation in service activities, incentives for service and the extent to which the school offers service-learning courses.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
Wheat for May delivery was up 3.25 cents to \$4.9325 a bushel; May corn fell .75 cent to 3.88 a bushel; May oats were 3.75 cents lower at \$2.8250 a bushel; while May soybeans were off 8.75 cents to \$9.8450 a bushel.  
Beef higher and pork was lower

on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
April live cattle was up .75 cent to \$1.5475 a pound; May feeder cattle rose 1.28 cents to \$2.0835 a pound; while April lean hogs were .10 cent lower at \$.6597 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks fell sharply on Tuesday, wiping out this year's gains for the Dow Jones industrial average and the Standard & Poor's 500 index. Investors are nervous about the likelihood of the first increase in U.S. interest rates in nine years and a plunge in the value of the euro as the dollar appreciates.

ON TUESDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 332.78 points, or 1.9 percent, to 17,662.94.  
The Standard & Poor's 500 index lost 35.27 points, or 1.7 percent, to 2,044.16.  
The Nasdaq composite fell

82.64 points, or 1.7 percent, to 4,859.79.

The Dow is down 193.84 points, or 1.1 percent.  
The S&P 500 index is down 27.10 points, or 1.3 percent.  
The Nasdaq is down 67.58 points, or 1.4 percent.

The S&P 500 index is down 14.74 points, or 0.7 percent.

Fatal Accident Near Freeman Tuesday

FREEMAN — A Montana man died Tuesday afternoon following a two-vehicle crash on S.D. Highway 44, 13 miles west of Freeman.

Keith Edward Stockard, 55, of Superior, Montana, was driving a 1999 Ford Explorer east on the shoulder of Highway 44, 13 miles east of Freeman. Jason Weber, 44, of Parkston was driving an unloaded garbage truck east on Highway 44, approaching the Stockard vehicle from the rear. Stockard attempted to conduct a U-turn at the intersection of Highway 44 and 428th Avenue in the path of the garbage truck and was struck.

Stockard was not wearing a seat belt and sustained life-threatening injuries in the crash. He was transported to a hospital and later died of his injuries.

No further information is immediately available. The South Dakota Highway Patrol is investigating. Hutchinson County Sheriff's Office, South Dakota Department of Transportation, Highway Patrol Motor Carrier Services, Freeman Police Department, Freeman Ambulance and Freeman Fire Department all assisted.
