






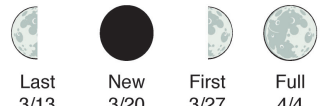

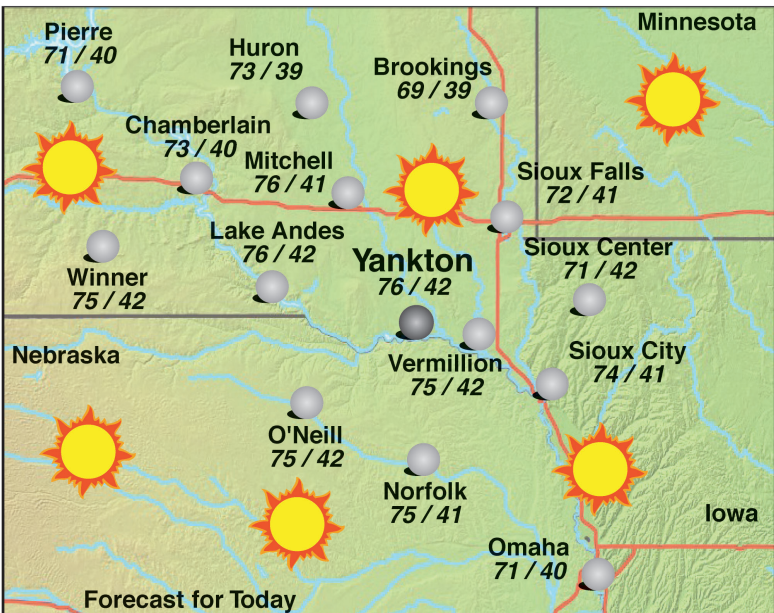

KNOX COUNTY SHERIFF'S REPORT

The Knox County Sheriff's Office was provided a letter with a check from Walmart Inc with instructions to go to the internet website [www.walmartreadygo.com](http://www.walmartreadygo.com). The letter looked official and the check looked authentic. The receiver of the letter however wasn't sure about its authenticity. For starters, it had her parents address on the envelope and was post-marked and stamped from a Hispanic country south of the border. The letter was slightly bigger than a standard 8x10 sheet of paper commonly used in southern countries. An Internet search confirmed that it was a scam to gain access to your banking information. The website is very authentic looking also.

If you receive letters with checks always verify whether it is real or not before you cash the check or give out information on the internet. If you receive a phone call from someone stating you've won something but you have to pay a fee to receive your winnings be hesitant. Never give out social security numbers, bank numbers, date of births or any other information that may identify you to people you don't know.

Always remember, if it's to good to be true, it's a scam no matter if they say you won money or want to

pave your driveway with leftover materials.

Lastly if you have any legal questions contact your attorney. If you have any other questions, ask your local law enforcement officer or call the Sheriff's Office.

- On March 2, 2015, the Knox County Sheriff's Office received a report of illegal dumping about one-half mile north of Verdel, Nebraska, on 516 Ave in the east ditch. CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly higher Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for May delivery was up 5.75 cents to \$4.99 a bushel; May corn rose 3 cents to 3.91 a bushel; May oats were .50 cent lower at \$2.82 a bushel; while May soybeans gained 8.25 cents to \$9.9275 a bushel.

Beef higher and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

April live cattle was up .85 cent to \$1.5560 a pound; May feeder cattle rose 2.90 cents to \$2.1125 a pound; while April lean hogs were 1.85 cents lower at \$.6412 a pound.

NEW YORK (AP) — U.S. stocks edged lower on Wednesday, extending losses from a sell-off a day earlier. Investors are nervous about the likelihood of higher U.S. interest rates and the sharp appreciation in the value of the dollar.
