James River Board Funds Projects

HURON — Chairman Randy Stanley of Groton announces that the James River Water Development District awarded \$300,547.71 in cost-sharing assistance at their recent Board of Directors meeting held in Huron on Thursday, March 12.

 The district awarded \$10,000 to Beadle Conservation District for purchasing a grass seeding drill. This drill will be used to plant all types of grasses for CRP, buffer strips, grassed waterways and cover crops that will help prevent the deposit of sediments and nutrients in the James River Watershed. The equipment will be used in Beadle County and surrounding areas.

• The district awarded \$100,000 to Spink County for berm erosion repairs on 4-5 County Bridges. Due to flooding on the James River in the past few years, the berms of the bridge crossings are eroded The repairs to the project sites would consist of rebuilding the berms with compacted clay fill, placing drainage fabric and rip rap on each berm. The funding will prevent future erosion and prevent damage to the bridges.

 \bullet The district awarded \$32,000 to Ducks Unlimited for three projects. The first project includes enhancement of a

10-acre wetland and seeding of 10 acres of cropland to a mix of grasses and forbs in Brown County. The completed project improvements will provide additional quality habitat for many local and migratory wildlife species to flourish and will complement existing nearby wildfire habitat on the Sand Lake National Wildlife refuge. The second project is to repair a pump station on a 200 acre wetland on the Renziehausen Slough Game Production Area in Brown County. As part of this project, the pump house will be repaired. In addition, several eroded sections along the levee system will be repaired. The completion of the project will once again allow water to be pumped out of the Crow Creek drainage system and into this wetland, providing excellent wildlife habitat and reducing the amount of water flowing down and ultimately into the James River. The third project is to restore three wetlands and 54 acres of grasslands on the Summit Ag Fund property in Sanborn County. The restored wetlands and grasslands will provide excellent habitat to a wide variety of wildlife species. The wetlands will be restored by filling drainage ditches with compacted soil in the form of ditch plugs. Former cropland acres will

be planted back to native grassland species.

• The district awarded \$19,000 to repair a dam in Capital Township in Hutchinson County.

• The district awarded \$29,063 to repair two dams in Kassel Township in Hutchinson County.

• The district awarded \$50,000 to build a new dam in Odessa Township in

Yankton County. • The district awarded \$10,484.71 for a sediment trap dam in Mitchell Township

in Davison County. ullet The district also awarded \$50,000 for further enhancements to the Conservation Reserve Program from Yankton County north to Brown and Marshall

Counties. The District's Enhanced CRP Program consists of a one-time, up-front, 75 percent incentive payment of the CRP base-rate in addition to a regular CRP payment from the following practices; CP8A, CP21, CP22, CP29 and ČP30.
