The annual Yankton Citywide Cleanup is scheduled to begin on Saturday, April 11. Residents on city garbage collection routes may dispose of those materials outlined below at no additional charge.

Materials may be dropped off at the Solid Waste Transfer Station located at 23rd and Kellen Gross Drive from April 11-18 at the following hours:

- Saturday, April 11, from 8 a.m.-3:45 p.m.
- Monday, April 13, to Friday, April 17, from 8 a.m.- 7
 - Saturday, April 18, from 8 a.m.-3:45 p.m.
- The following type of materials may be disposed of at no additional charge for residents on the city garbage routes: tree branches, wood products, metal items and minimal concrete.

If you are on a city garbage collection route, city crews will pick up the materials if you follow these steps

- 1. Separate materials by type into piles.
- 2. Piles must be placed at the street curb on the day that your regular garbage is picked up. These items will not be picked up in alleys.
- 3. Piles must be placed directly in front of your property and not in front of adjacent neighboring property. 4. Tree branches shall be no longer than 10 feet in
- 5. Garbage cans set out for normal collection must be set away from piles and left in alleys.


