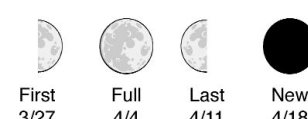

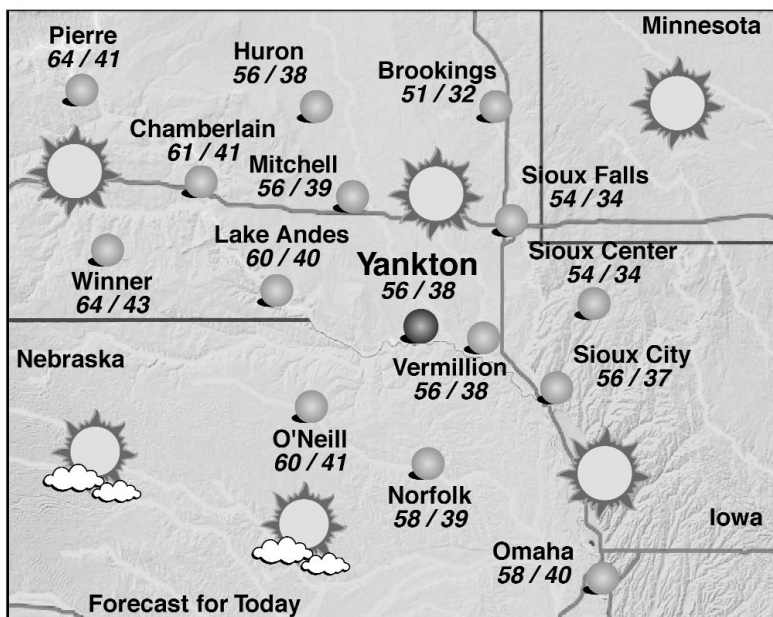

RiverWalk Offers 2015 Sneak Peak

RiverWalk committee members will raise funds for public art by bartending at Czeckers Thursday, March 26. All tips from 5:30-8 p.m. will be used to assist in funding 15 new sculptures.

"We are proud of the new sculptures which will soon be on the streets of downtown and want to offer a sneak peak before installation in May," said Beth Rye of the RiverWalk committee.

Bartenders will include committee members Rye, Todd Larson, Katie Hunhoff, Jan and David Jensen, Mike Schumacher, Tom Pier, Sadie Hansen and Beth Gellerman. Appetizers will be donated by Czecker's and offered free to RiverWalk supporters.

"This is a new idea the committee had to bring in more funds for our granite pedestals. We are offering people the chance to win the opportunity to dedicate a sculpture in memory of a loved one, or maybe put their kids' names or an organization they support. We think it will be a great fundraiser for us," said Sadie Hansen. Tickets are \$10 each or 3 for \$25.

RiverWalk began in 2010 with 10 sculptures decorating Yankton's downtown and riverfront. Using a map and brochure provided by local stores or by using the Yankton RiverWalk app on your cellphone, people can stroll through the sculpture walk and read about each piece of art and the artist.

L.C. Lake Sediment Meeting Planned

NIORBARA, Neb. — Researchers are taking a closer look at the sand and sediment accumulating in the delta at the headwaters of Lewis and Clark Lake.

The Nebraska Water Science Center of the U.S. Geological Survey has been involved in several research activities focused on sediment in the Niobrara River and Lewis and Clark Lake areas in the past year. The public is invited to hear more about these projects at the Missouri Sedimentation Action Coalition's 14th annual membership meeting set for 7 p.m. March 31 at the Fire Hall in Niobrara, Neb.

Topics that USGS staff will present include: outcomes of the Large Rivers Initiative workshop held in Yankton in August 2014, study of the sediment flush through Spencer Dam on the lower Niobrara River, and channel and riparian changes in the Niobrara River upstream from the Spencer Dam that may affect sandbars nesting habitat. The center, located in Lincoln, operates local and statewide networks to collect high-quality data that define natural and human-induced hydrologic conditions. Staff analyzes hydrologic processes through investigations and research to increase understanding of important water-resource issues and to promote informed decision making.

This spring, the center will begin research to characterize the delta sediment deposits at the head of Lewis and Clark Lake.

All MSAC members, potential members and the general public are invited and encouraged to attend the meeting. Brief business items are on the agenda including the election of two individuals to the board of directors for three-year terms. The following two directors have terms which are expiring, Pete Jahraus, representing governmental units, and Jeff Peters, representing organizations.

The public is invited to join MSAC March 31 at the Niobrara Fire Hall for the annual meeting at 7 p.m. and the board of directors meeting at 4 p.m. Off-street parking is available to the west near the funeral home and churches. MSAC also will update attendees on the organization's activities, future goals and recent developments involving sedimentation.

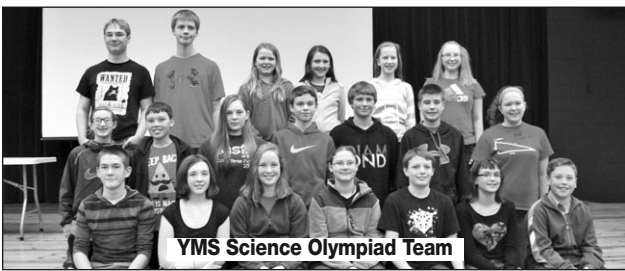
Yankton High School and Yankton Middle School took top honors at the South Dakota Science Olympiad, held Saturday on the campus of the University of South Dakota in Vermillion.
