In the span of one hour during our weekly Sports Chat on Monday, the topics switched between the upcoming arena at the University of South Dakota and athletics at Mount Marty College. And I couldn't help but connect the two. While, yes, on completely different wavelengths (Division I vs. NAIA), it's hard not to look at Mount Marty and envision what life would be like with an athletic fieldhouse — some kind of new facility to house the athletic programs, as well as an expanded area for strength & conditioning. Certainly, this topic cannot be fully addressed in this small space, but it's my hope that at some point, it's a topic that gets discussed in Yankton circles. Let's put it simply: Mount Marty needs a fieldhouse. I'm not talking some \$20 million facility that would completely reshape the look and feel of the small campus in Yankton. And not necessarily something to house basketball games and volleyball matches

— like the case in Vermillion.

For comparison sake, let's look north at Dakota Wesleyan University in Mitchell. That school broke ground last September for a \$10.5 million health and wellness center that will house a 200-meter indoor track, space for exercise equipment, a wrestling room (which of course wouldn't be a concern at Mount Marty), locker rooms, and the list goes on, as you can imagine. It's not a matter of 'we have to keep up with so and so,' but in the grand scheme of your university, it quite honestly is. Let's take recruiting out of the equation for a second. When you have a student population like Mount Marty has, where a high percentage of those students living on campus are athletes, it — in my opinion — should at least be a priority. The question, of course, is fundraising. Where would you get the money? (DWU, for example, got nearly \$6 million from two families, as well as \$2.5 million from Avera Health). That proves that it's certainly possible, it just takes some effort. Such a facility is not only a commitment to your athletic programs, it's a commitment to your university, that you truly want to take the school to a new level.

**SDSU's Jumper Named POW**  
ELMHURST, Ill. — South Dakota State University relief pitcher Talon Jumper was honored Monday as the Summit League Pitcher of the Week, after helping lead the Jackrabbits to a series victory at Western Illinois. A senior from Brighton, Colorado, Jumper earned saves in both SDSU victories in the three-game series. The right-hander began the weekend by pitching the final three innings of an 8-5 Jackrabbits victory in the series opener on March 20, allowing two hits and striking out three batters. Jumper also pitched a scoreless ninth inning two days later in the series finale to close out a 9-7 Jackrabbits win. Combined, Jumper did not allow a run over four innings in his two appearances. He struck out four and did not walk a batter in lowering his season earned run average to 0.73. Jumper is the third Jackrabbit player to earn a Summit League weekly award this season, joining Player of the Week honorees Reid Clary (March 2) and Zach Coppola (March 9). SDSU, 9-11 overall and 2-4 in league play, resumes Summit League action with a three-game series Friday through Sunday at Fort Wayne.

Daytona State College, which shot a two-round 597 (297-300) on the par-72, 6,113 Juliette Falls Golf Resort course, leads. Junior Sydney MacDonald (Winnipeg, Manitoba) shot a one-over par 73 for the second consecutive day and is tied for sixth with a two-over par 146. MacDonald is five shots back of Daytona State's Ji Sun Kang, who is shooting a three-over par 141 (69-72). For the Jacks, sophomores Megan Mingo (Yankton) and Hallie Getz (Pierre) are tied for 12th. Mingo shot a 77 (149) and Getz a two-over par 74 (149).

**3 Iowa Wrestlers Suspended**  
IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) — Three University of Iowa wrestlers have been suspended indefinitely after being arrested last week in eastern Iowa. Marion police lieutenant Scott Elam on Monday said an officer stopped freshmen Seth Gross, Ross Lembeck and Logan Ryan on March 18 after the car Lembeck was driving matched the description of one suspected to be connected to a theft in the area. Lembeck was charged with drunken driving. Gross was given a citation for open container and for interference with official acts. All three were charged with possession of alcohol underage.

**NFL Suspending TV Blackouts**  
PHOENIX (AP) — The NFL is saying bye-bye to blackouts. At least for 2015. No NFL games will be blocked from local television next season, the league said Monday at the owners' meetings. The teams voted for a one-year suspension of the long-standing blackout policy for the preseason and regular season. There were no blackouts last season, because the minimum number of tickets, by NFL sellout standards, was sold for every game, and the league had only two blackouts in 2013.
