so important? "It allows us to look at expanding our current programs and at bringing new programs into the community," Hanson said. "As an example, at United Way, we partner with Girls On The Run, which is a new program started this spring that will continue in the fall. United Way is providing scholarships to be part of this program.'

United Way & Volunteer Services of Greater Yankton supports more than 35 programs facilitated by 24 partner agencies and some facilitated by United Way staff. The programs combat poverty and support education and health initiatives.

United Way campaign cochairman Jay Gravholt said he is passionate about the fund drive because he sees the individuals of all ages who benefit from programs.

The state Department of Public Safety submitted the driver license legislation, House Bill 1041.

"We totally understand nobody likes increasing fees," Jenna Howell, a lawyer for the department, said at a Jan. 30 hearing before the House Appropriations Committee. "The driver license program is entirely self-funded."

The previous increases came in 2009.

That year the price for a driver license rose to \$20 from \$8 while the price for a commercial driver license went up to \$25 from \$15. The Highway Patrol received \$5 per license from those increases.

Howell said the program would finish \$875,000 in the red during 2016 without the new round of increases this year.

The fee increases would balance the costs through 2024, according to Howell. She said the only alternative would be "drastic cuts" to personnel and services. which is something we do not want to do.'

The actual cost is \$29.75 per license, according to Howell. The department has covered the difference through fees charged on motorist records, she said.

The House of Representatives approved the increases 57-12. The Senate gave its OK 25-8. The governor signed the measure into law March 13. 'This will take care of it for
