and lucky we are to have these programs."

Why are the final dollars so important?

"It allows us to look at expanding our current programs and at bringing new programs into the community," Hanson said. "As an example, at United Way, we partner with Girls On The Run, which is a new program started this spring that will continue in the fall. United Way is providing scholarships to be part of this program."

United Way & Volunteer Services of Greater Yankton supports more than 35 programs facilitated by 24 partner agencies and some facilitated by United Way staff. The programs combat poverty and support education and health initiatives.

United Way campaign co-chairman Jay Gravholt said he is passionate about the fund drive because he sees the individuals of all ages who benefit from programs.

"I would like to see us get over the threshold (with the current fundraising)," he said. "We help young people with programs like Sack Pack; Big Friend, Little Friend; and Boys and Girls Club, all the way to the seniors with RSVP (Retired Senior Volunteer Program)."

Many people depend on United Way programs in their daily lives, Gravholt said.

"For many kids, the Sack Pack program is the only nutritional meal they get all weekend. An awful lot of kids go hungry that shouldn't go hungry," he said. "There are also a lot of senior citizens who are going hungry and who shouldn't, either."

In addition, the United Way drive benefits programs such as the River City Domestic Violence Center, Gravholt said. Unfortunately, the center has seen an increasing need in recent months, he said.

Each dollar in the United Way campaign can mean the difference in whether another person receives help or must go without it, Gravholt said.

"It doesn't need to be a big donation (for the final push)," he said. "You can give \$1 or \$2. It might mean something as little as giving up a can of pop in a week."

As part of Thursday's promotion, each donation of \$5 or more will be entered into a drawing for an iPad mini, donated by Wal-Mart. Donations can be brought to Hy-Vee, and organizations' donations can be recognized on-air with KYNT radio station's Scott Kooistra.

Organizations desiring to donate on air should contact United Way at (605) 665-6766 to coordinate a broadcast time. Anyone is welcome to stop by the United Way booths at Hy-Vee and show support.

For those unable to attend Thursday's LAST BLAST, donations can be made by texting GIVE2015 to 41444, Hanson said. The donor can still be entered in the iPad drawing or schedule as an annual pledge to United Way. Donations can also be made online.

United Way campaign co-chairman Marc Bies said the increasing local needs prompted him to suggest raising the bar for this year's drive.

"When we started our campaign in September, I spoke with Lauren and asked if we should increase our campaign goal instead of staying at the amount we have been at for the last few years," he said.

"The reason I asked this question was, as a member of the United Way Board, I have listened to the requests of our partner agencies to meet the needs of their groups and the requests of new groups as they reach out to the less fortunate of our community."

Bies went forward with his idea, challenging the Yankton community to reach a \$500,000 goal. He referred to the campaign theme, "LIVE UNITED."

"As we reach the end of our campaign, we're close to reaching that goal due to the generosity of many in our community," he said. "For

that reason, we now are doing our 'Last Blast,' one last request to help United Way reach our goal and therefore help our community."

Gravholt credited a highly visible kick-off event and an improving economy as major reasons for this year's record-breaking fund drive. However, he also believes United Way succeeds because area residents believe in the organization and its track record.

"People like the United Way because the money stays local," he said. "And people who make up the board are community members in all aspects. We try to get a dynamic group (on the board). We're all very dedicated to making Yankton a better place."

The state Department of Public Safety submitted the driver license legislation, House Bill 1041.

"We totally understand nobody likes increasing fees," Jenna Howell, a lawyer for the department, said at a Jan. 30 hearing before the House Appropriations Committee. "The driver license program is entirely self-funded."

The previous increases came in 2009.

That year the price for a driver license rose to \$20 from \$8 while the price for a commercial driver license went up to \$25 from \$15. The Highway Patrol received \$5 per license from those increases.

In addition, Hanson stressed the importance of grass-roots support for the United Way fund drive.

"We emphasize this isn't a United Way success as much as it is a community success. We're proud of it," she said.

But work remains, and the final push comes Thursday, Bies said.

"Please consider giving what you can so the remaining \$15,000 can be raised and the good work of our 35 partner agencies can be supported," he said. "I have every confidence that the Yankton community will rally behind this effort and 'LIVE UNITED.'"

Howell said the program would finish \$875,000 in the red during 2016 without the new round of increases this year.

The fee increases would balance the costs through 2024, according to Howell. She said the only alternative would be "drastic cuts" to personnel and services, "which is something we do not want to do."

The actual cost is \$29.75 per license, according to Howell. The department has covered the difference through fees charged on motorist records, she said.

The House of Representatives approved the increases 57-12. The Senate gave its OK 25-8. The governor signed the measure into law March 13.

"This will take care of it for nine additional years projected," Rep. Dan Dryden, R-Rapid City, said at the hearing.


