opportunity to look at Freeman — not just the (health care facilities), but also the community," he said. "We just felt very welcome here, and it also gave them a

chance to look at me.' The interim role also provided a ready-made transition for taking on permanent duties. However, he admitted differences when he changed his status.

"When I had the interim role, I kind of looked at, 'What are the priorities today? Somebody else will be the administrator who makes the decisions where we go tomorrow," he said.
"Once I moved from interim to permanent, the role changed. My vision and the board needed to be in sync, and now I was taking on a long-term approach.

FRHS board member Lori Uecker told the Freeman Courier weekly newspaper she couldn't be happier with

"I feel like I can speak for the whole board and tell you that we are truly relieved that the facility didn't have to limp along without an administrator," Uecker told the Courier.

Brandner's background meshes well with the FRHS needs, Uecker told the Courier.

Because Nick brings with him so many years of experience in the health care field, and many of those in facilities like ours, we just felt very comfortable offering him the position," she

### **BRINGING EXPERIENCE**

Brandner brings about a quarter-century of health care experience in a wide variety of settings.

A Herreid native, he earned his degree as a registered nurse from Presentation College in Aberdeen and remains a licensed nurse in South Dakota. He earned his bachelor's degree in business from Northern State University in Aberdeen and his master's degree in health care administration from the University of Missouri at Columbia.

His career in health administration began at Medcenter One in Bismarck, North Dakota. He then worked as vice president for patient care at St. Mary's Hospital in Pierre as part of the Catholic Health Initiatives (CHI) system. He was then promoted to administrator at another CHI facility in Albany, Minnesota.

Brandner moved back to South Dakota, where he served for three years as administrator at the Redfield hospital, an independent facility like FRHS.

"At Freeman, we're an independent hospital, but we work with both the Avera and Sanford health care systems,' he said. "Our medical records are actually on the Avera MEDITECH platform. Our support for that (platform) comes out of Avera Sacred

Heart Hospital in Yankton.' Brandner praised his employees for their professionalism.

"I have a lot of respect for the medical staff and for the staff in general," he said.
"We're moving forward and looking for ways to improve

However, Brandner

admits the challenge of finding and keeping good staff, particularly in a rural area,

can be difficult. "We currently have two physicians, and we have a third physician on board in October," he said. "We have two mid-level practitioners. We have a physician assistant, a nurse practitioner and we're recruiting an advanced practice practitioner."

However, staffing remains a concern in all departments, including nurses and aides, at each facility, he said. FRHS employs approximately 140 full- and part-time employees, he said.

"Keeping staff up to par can be challenging," he said. FRHS benefits from the

physicians and other health care professionals with the Avera and Sanford systems who provide services from Yankton, Sioux Falls and elsewhere, Brandner said. FRHS has gained a great benefit from the electronic services (e-services) offered through the Avera Sacred Heart Hospital emergency department in Yankton and an e-pharmacy service through area pharmacists, he said.

**ONE TEAM** 

Health care remains a business, and Brandner focuses on finances, costs, reimbursements, fundraising and updating facilities and equipment. Next week, FRHS is installing a 64-slice CT scanner as part of its technology upgrade.

Many times, it means making tough choices and looking at making the most of limited resources, he said.

"My philosophy is that a place like Freeman won't have everything that the big centers do," he said. "There are things we choose to do and things we have to do."

Brandner noted the importance of preparing for any turbulent waters in the years ahead.

"Health care is constantly changing, and we look at all these things," he said. "The rules are changing all the time. In Congress, they are still talking about eliminating Obamacare. We don't know what that means and what's coming in to replace it. We're not sure where it's going."

Regardless of where national health reform goes, rural health facilities such as

vital role, Brandner said. "To have a hospital and other health care facilities, it's tremendous for a community like this. It's an economic engine for the

community,' he said. "It's also services that you don't have to go out of town for, especially when we're 35 miles from Yankton and 50 miles from Sioux Falls. But also having the eservices immediately available is a tremendous asset."

At FRHS, the core mission will remain focused on the people served by the facilities, Brandner said.

"A rural community hospital is extremely important in a state like South Dakota, he said. "It's extremely important that we run the organization the best we can and that we stay out there in front when it comes to serving the public's needs."
