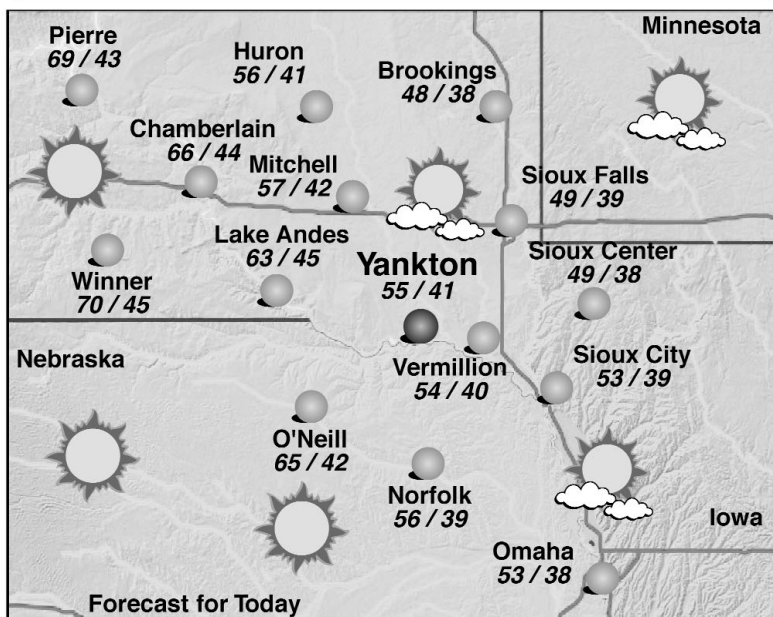

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for May delivery gained 8.50 cents to \$5.0775 a bushel; May corn fell .25 cent to 3.91 a bushel; May oats were 5.50 cents lower at \$2.7275 a bushel; while May soybeans was off 7.25 cents to \$9.6725 a bushel. Beef was higher and pork was

lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle was up .97 cent to \$1.5297 a pound; May feeder cattle rose 2.35 cents to \$2.1812 a pound; while June lean hogs were .15 cent lower to \$.75 a pound.

Technical Issue Affecting Vehicle Registration System In Some Counties Fixed

PIERRE — Friday morning a technical issue surfaced, preventing some counties across the state from accessing a system that allows South Dakota drivers to renew their vehicle registration.

Several counties, Division of Motor Vehicle self-service terminals and an online customer portal were functioning properly. "A software setting was altered, which created a technical barrier between some counties and the state's system," Jim Edman, Deputy Commissioner for the Bureau of Information and Telecommunication (BIT) said. "The solution involved restoring the necessary SDCars browser

settings for users. We gathered all available staff to resolve the problem as quickly as possible in order to get the system running for county office use."

Peggy Laurenz, Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles said, "We understand the problems counties faced today with not being able to provide their usual high level of customer service, due to SDCars being down."

Andy Gerlach, Secretary of the South Dakota Department of Revenue, said, "This technical issue did not affect, nor was it related to, any of the Highway Funding Bill updates that are still on schedule to be implemented April 1."

WALL ST. RECAP

A tough week on the stock market ended quietly Friday. Major indexes notched modest gains, not nearly enough to make up for the four previous days of losses. It wound up being the second-worst week for the market so far this year. There was no major catalyst to move the market one way or another Friday. Biotechnology stocks, battered over the last week, were among the top gainers, while energy stocks lagged as the price of oil fell.
