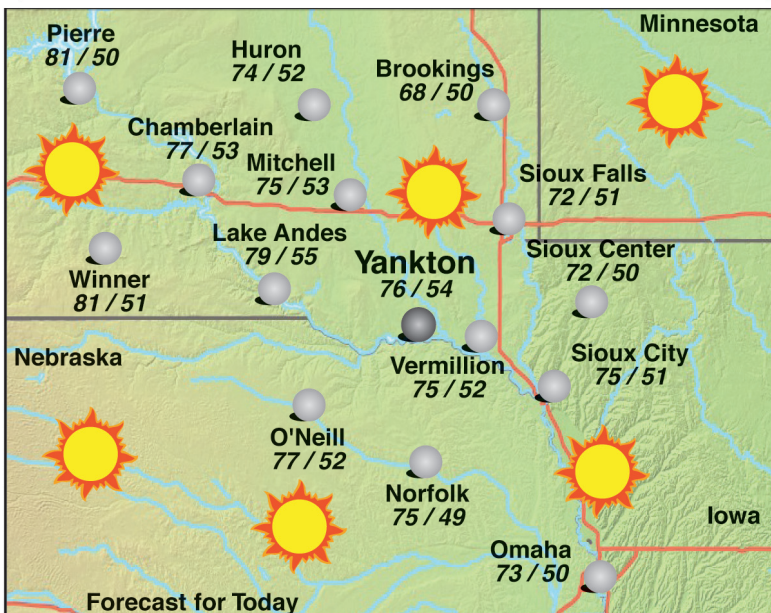

U.S. stock indexes closed sharply higher on Monday following encouraging news on consumer spending and home sales. Energy stocks and banks notched some of the biggest gains. The latest round of corporate deals also helped lift the market.

Beef was mostly lower and pork

was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
June live cattle was unchanged at \$1.5297 a pound; May feeder cattle fell .67 cent to \$2.1745 a pound; while June lean hogs were .55 cent higher to \$.7555 a pound.
