percent, rather than the 8 percent that he said the rate should be.

"All we're asking for is, don't tax the tax," Novstrup said.

Rep. Thomas Brunner, R-Nisland, said the three providers of electricity to consumers — investor owned companies, rural cooperatives and municipal governments — don't quarrel over the tax structure.

The problem has been a recent interpretation by the state Revenue Department, according to legislators.

"It's just the way it's imposed," Brunner said.

House members voted 63-1 to override the veto.

An override required a two-thirds majority in each chamber. SB 136 came into the veto debate strong, after receiving approval by the House 67-1 on March 5 and 34-0 by the Senate on March 9.

The Senate fell short of the 24 ayes needed for two-thirds majorities on two other vetoes.

Senators voted 21-11 on an exemption from state and local sales taxes being levied on salaries for

American Legion and VFW baseball coaches.

Sen. Brock Greenfield, R-Clark, said the Revenue Department started charging the taxes in 2012. But Sen. Larry Tidemann, R-Brookings, asked why not an exemption for soccer and hockey coaches too.

Senators voted 22-10 on creating a leased residential classification for property tax purposes.

Sen. Deb Peters, R-Hartford, said the bill's purpose was to collect data.

Peters said the discussion about whether to reduce the general education tax levy could occur after the information became available.

She said there is a shortage of leased residential housing in some communities.

Sen. Jim Peterson, D-Revillo, said he "probably" could support SB 100 if the savings would be passed down to renters but he said that treatment was "unlikely."

"There's only one reason this bill is being brought," Peterson said.

In other news, a legislator announced his resignation as the session ended Monday.

Sen. Dan Lederman, R-Dakota

Dunes, said he was stepping down immediately. He cited family reasons.

Lederman served seven years and was the Senate Republican assistant leader for the 2014 and 2015 sessions.

Lederman recommended that the governor appoint Rep. Jim Bolin, R-Canton, to the vacancy. The governor announced a few hours later that he was accepting nominations from the public.

Bolin is serving his fourth consecutive term in the House and isn't eligible to seek a fifth straight term in the House in 2016. Bolin recently had declared in a statement on the floor of the House that he wouldn't be running in 2016.

Lederman won re-election last November against Democratic challenger Ann Tornberg of Beresford.

Tornberg subsequently won election as chairwoman for the South Dakota Democratic Party. She served the 2015 session as office administrator for the Senate Democratic caucus at the state Capitol.

Lederman serves District 16 which covers Union County and much of Lincoln County. Bolin and Rep. David Anderson, R-Hudson, hold the district's two House seats.

The governor appointed Anderson to fill a vacancy in 2013 after the resignation of then-Rep. Patty Miller, R-McCook Lake.

"enemy pie" (which turned out to be just a regular pie).

"I hope that the kids realized that people are much more than how they look on the outside," Rodriguez said. "I think it shows how to create a friend out of your enemies."

It certainly changed Novak's recipe.

"I would make it with some really good stuff," Novak said. "I would make it with good strawberries and cherries."

Rodriguez said that she is excited to talk to more kids about bullying because she believes it is a big issue.

"Especially now," she said. "There are so many different forms of it. A huge one is cyberbullying these days. People do not realize how much it can hurt."

Examples of cyberbullying include mean-spirited text messages or emails, rumors sent by email or posted on social networking sites, and embarrassing pictures, videos, websites or fake profiles.

According to stopbullying.gov, effects of bullying include use of alcohol and drugs, skipping school,

poor grades, low self-esteem and depression.

The 2013 Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance Survey finds that 15 percent of high school students (grades 9-12) were electronically bullied in the past year.

Research on cyberbullying is growing, however, because children's technology use changes all the time.

Though Rodriguez said she doesn't have any personal experiences with bullying herself, she has heard stories of people and friends who have been bullied in the past.

"Though it is something that no one wants to remember — they do," she said. "Bullying sticks with people."

Rodriguez said she hopes that if one of the kids sees another kid getting bullied or are being bullied themselves, they will inform an adult.
