

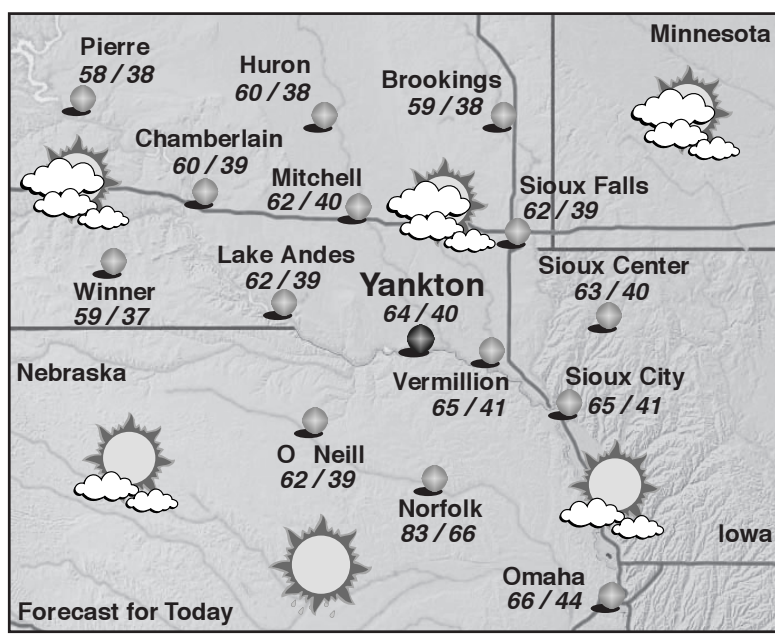

The two wells, which will be approximately 100 feet deep, are scheduled to be drilled in late May, according to Goodmanson.

Boring underneath the Missouri River is set for mid-June, he continued. The process will commence from the Nebraska side of the river. A high-density polyethylene pipe 1,600 feet in length will be pulled through from the South Dakota side of the river.

Currently, the segments of that pipeline are sitting on the north-west side of the Meridian Bridge.

The two wells — and a third one, if necessary — will replace the 5-million-gallon capacity of the east intake valve, which draws water from the surface of the river. Because of the scouring of the riverbed that has occurred since the installation of Gavins Point Dam, it is no longer feasible to use the east surface intake. A west surface intake valve will remain in use.

Some adjustments will be made to the city's water treatment system to account for the different water source.

"The water we get from the wells is going to be a little bit harder, so there might be some more softening that needs to be



done," Goodmanson said.

The well water will be integrated into the system slowly, and users should not notice any difference in the quality of their water. Variable-speed drives being installed on the intake pumps will allow water treatment plant operators to regulate the amount of water coming into the system from the wells versus the remaining surface intake valve.

"We're going to be able to determine if we want 10 percent well water and 90 percent river water, for example," Goodmanson said. "To begin with, we'll be using mostly river water and slowly adding the well water."

As the city gets accustomed to the well water source, it is expected to reduce issues related to higher water quality standards, zebra mussels and frazil ice.

The completion date for the well project is November.

"Hopefully, we can get them up in November and be treating some well water rather than river water," Goodmanson said.

"Everything is moving forward so far."
