while doing all it could to mitigate the disaster, would require well owner BP America to bear all costs. "Your government will do whatever it takes for as long as it takes to stop this crisis," he said.

"BP is responsible for this leak. BP will be paying the bill," Obama said after a Coast Guard briefing in Venice, a Gulf Coast community serving as a staging area for the response. He stood before cameras in a heavy rain, water dripping from his face.

The president also stopped to talk with six local fishermen and said the challenge is "How do we

plug this hole?" After that, he said, protecting the estuaries would be the next priority.

Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano said any comparison between the ruptured BP oil well and Katrina was "a total mischaracterization" and that the government had taken an "all hands

Vermillion Man Dies In Fiery Crash

BERESFORD (AP) — Authorities have released the names of two drivers killed when their pickups collided head-on and burst into flames near Beresford.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol identified them as 35-year-old Aaron Hoelsing of Beresford and 40-year-old Daniel Ruring of Vermillion.

The patrol says Hoelsing was traveling north in the south-bound passing lane of Interstate 29 about 10 p.m. Friday and collided with Ruring's truck, which was heading south in the same lane. Both vehicles were destroyed in the crash and ensuing fire.

The patrol says both drivers were killed upon impact.
