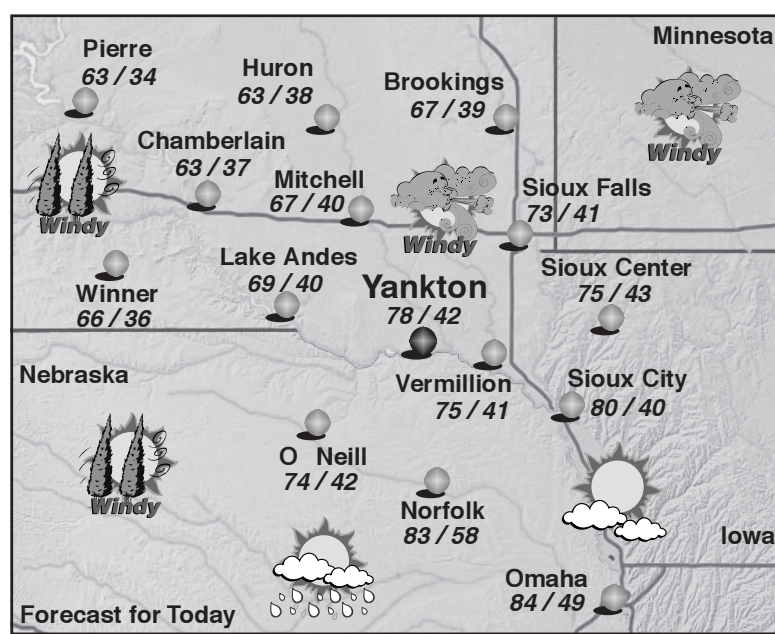

### Lake Andes Awarded Community Dev. Grant

PIERRE — Lake Andes has been awarded \$257,500 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) money to upgrade its wastewater collection system.  
 About 80 percent of the sewer lines and 75 percent of manholes in Lake Andes are part of the original, 1920s installation. The lines have a variety of problems, such as root intrusions, sediment accumulation, sagging and general deterioration.  
 CDBG is a reimbursement program, and the community will receive the funds as work is completed. The CDBG program provides communities with financial resources to address a wide range of unique community development needs.  
 Past grants have been used for improvements and construction of community buildings, fire halls, water systems, and sewer systems. The federal Department of Housing and Urban Development funds the CDBG program, and the Governor's Office of Economic Development administers it.

### Transfer Station Sets Grass Clippings Policy

The City of Yankton Transfer Station will begin accepting only grass clippings in the evenings from 6-8 p.m. on Wednesday, May 5. Beginning on that date, the Transfer Station will be open on Wednesday evenings until further notice.  
 Grass clippings may also be taken to the Transfer Station during normal business hours of 8 a.m.-3:45 p.m. Monday through Saturday.  
 The City of Yankton reminds the public to keep foreign materials, such as garbage, tree limbs and branches, batteries of all kinds and all other items out of the grass clippings. Empty all leaf and grass bags on the pile and dispose of bags in dumpster next to the grass pile.

### Yankton Letter Carriers To Help In Food Drive

The Yankton letter carriers will be participating in a nationwide, one-day food drive on May 8.  
 Last year NALC branches collected more than 73 million pounds of food. Area postal employees, along with numerous volunteers collected 4,100 pounds. The non-perishable items are distributed by the local food pantry.  
 City and rural postal customers in Yankton, Mission Hill, Gayville and Utica are asked to place the food donations by their mailbox. The letter carrier or a volunteer will pick it up. Donations can also be brought to the post office lobby. Non-food items such as laundry soap, diapers, paper products, etc., will also be accepted.
