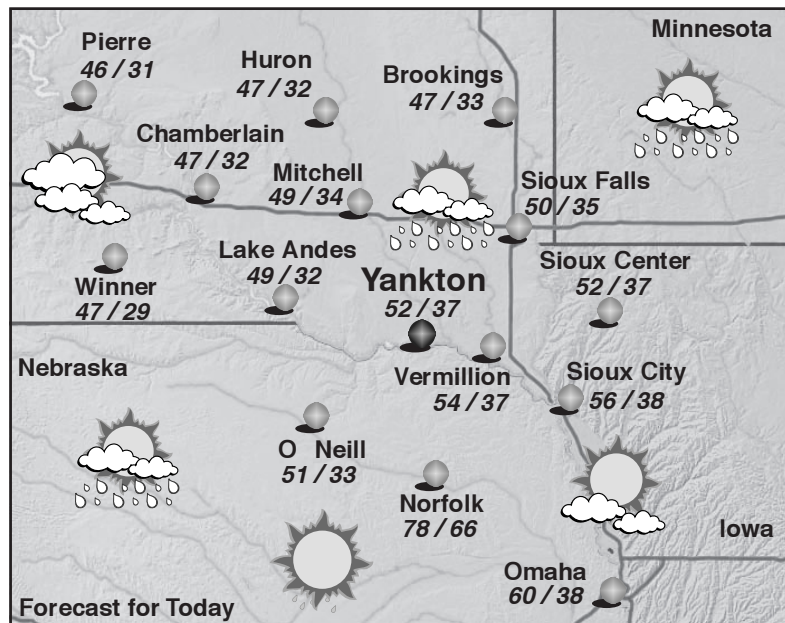

**Saturday, May 7, 1960**  
 • A casual offer by a friend to join him on an afternoon's ride ended in death near Dell Rapids Friday afternoon for Charles Sarkis of Watertown. He was a passenger in a car that was in a collision with a truck driven by a Sioux Falls man.
