5+12 YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING April 20th, 2010

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Chairman Bruce Jensen at 1:30 PM on Tuesday, April 20th, 2010.

Roll Call was taken with the following Commissioners present: Donna Freng, Bruce Jensen, Mark Johnson, Allen Sinclair, Bill Tamsiea was absent.

Action 10141C: A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Freng to adjust the regular session of the Board convene in Executive Session to address a personnel issue.

The Board reconvened in regular session and Chairman announced action would be taken at 4:30 PM as a result of the Executive Session.

Action 10142C: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Freng to recess the regular session of the Board and convene as a Board of Equalization.

Action 10143C: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Freng to reconvene in regular session.

Action 10144C: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Sinclair to approve the agenda as distributed.

Action 10145C: A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Johnson to approve the minutes of the April 6th, 2010 meeting of the

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Board. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

Action 10146C: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Sinclair to recess the regular session of the Board and convene in Executive Session to address indigent requests.

Action 10147C: A motion was made by Freng and seconded by Johnson to reconvene in regular session.

The ambulance report for the month of March 2010 was presented by Steve Hawkins. The department responded to 127 calls in March with 106 1st calls, 15 2nd/3rd calls, 0 standby and 18 transfers and 6 Command/supervisor responses.

Action 10151A: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Freng to adjust the following bills: Medicare adjustments \$26,947.02, Medicaid adjustment \$6,270.37, miscellaneous uncollectible bills totaling \$2,019.16 and the liens moved to inactive status and \$888.28 in miscellaneous uncollectible bills.

Hawkins discussed the leaking roof at the ambulance facility. Hawkins advised he has contacted all the roofing contractors in Yankton and has received only one proposal as follows: Roy Johnson Roofing, Inc Area A \$7,750.00, Area B \$4,225.00 and Area C \$2,786.00.

Action 10152A: A motion was made by Freng and seconded by Sinclair to authorize repair to Area A in the amount of \$7,750, with additional expenditures not to exceed \$400.00.

Action 10153A: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Sinclair to authorize additional standby duties/salaries for the Polar Plunge on April 18th, Missouri River Clean up May 7th & 8th, Optimist Club Baseball

Action 10154A: A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Johnson to declare the week of May 16 through 22, 2010 as EMS Week and further to authorize expenditures not to exceed \$200.

Action 10155A: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Sinclair to accept into the record the report of the Ambulance Department for March, 2010.

Action 10156C: A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Johnson to recess the regular session and convene as a Board of Equalization.

Chairman Jensen reconvened the regular session of the Board.

Action 10157Z: A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Freng to adopt the following resolution: Whereas it appears that Jerome & Dorothy Sylliaasen and Jim & Lyn Lyons, owners of record, have caused a plat to be made of the following real property: A portion of the NW4, a Replat of Lot 1 Gunderson's Tract B, a replat of Lot 1 Gunderson's Addition, a replat of a portion of Gunderson's Addition, all in NW4, Section 32, Township 94N, Range 54W of the 5th PM, Yankton County, South Dakota and has submitted such plat to the Yankton County Planning Commission and the County Commission, of Yankton County, South Dakota for approval. Now therefore be it resolved that such plat has been executed according to the law and conforms to all existing applicable zoning, subdivision and erosion and sediment control and the same is hereby approved. The county Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to endorse on such plat the proper resolution and certify the same.

The issue regarding the Yankton-Clay Ditch #2 was returned to the table. Vern Arens presented various options for addressing the current problems with the ditch. Arens will return to the May 4th meeting with cost estimates. Rob Klimisch advised the Board only the County could effect a bond for financing and recommended ditch members organize and work with a contractor and lender to address the issue. Klimisch also advised that Certificates of Assessment for financing purposes should be investigated.

Gary Welter, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, presented the renewal options for County employee medical insurance for the 2010-2011 insurance year. Welter will return to the May 4th meeting to present comparisons for the Board.

Lori Mackey, DOE, presented budget expenditure projections for the remaining 2010 and the 2011 budgets to allow for the purchase of new software for her department.

Action 10158DOE: A motion was made by Freng and seconded by Johnson to enter into a contract with Manatron/Proval for comput-

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er assisted mass appraisal software for an implementation cost of \$107,631 and an annual support fee of \$7,180 to be paid over a three-year time frame.

The Board discussed the request for mag water application(s) for dust control along Chalkstone Road and Sisters Grove Road (approximately .6 mile).

Action 10159H: A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Sinclair to approve the request and

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add the requested area application to the mag water application schedule.

The Auditor advised an Emergency Action Plan for Marindahl Dam has been received for County signatures. The Board asked that the Emergency Manager review the plan prior to signatures being affixed.
