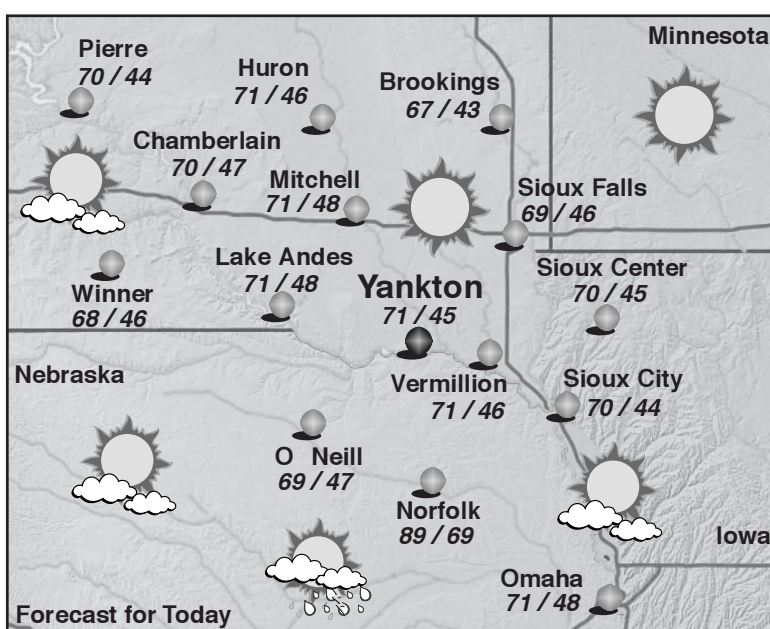

### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

Agricultural futures retreated Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery dropped 12.5 cents to \$4.79 a bushel; July corn fell 5.25 cents to \$3.73 a bushel; July soybeans slipped 1 cent to \$9.645 a bushel; and July oats dropped 5 cents to \$1.98 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef and pork prices were mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle fell .13 cent to 95.57 cents a pound; August feeder cattle gained .30 cent to \$1.1507 a pound; June lean hogs dropped 1.05 cents to \$4.60 cents a pound; and May pork bellies gained 3 cents to \$1.05 a pound.

### Man Pleads Guilty To Rural Mail Theft

**SIoux FALLS** — A Yankton mail carrier has pleaded guilty to stealing mail from a rural route, according to the U.S. Attorney's Office in Sioux Falls.

Brandon G. Novak, 42, appeared before U.S. Magistrate John E. Simko May 5 and pleaded guilty to one count of an indictment that charged him with five counts of Theft of Mail by a Postal Service Employee.

The maximum penalty upon conviction is five years imprisonment and/or a \$250,000 fine.

According to U.S. Attorney Brendan Johnson, Novak had been a full-time United States Postal Service employee since 1996 and was assigned to deliver mail on Rural Route 7 in Yankton. Between July 1, 2009, and Oct. 15, 2009, Novak came into possession of correspondence and other mail items intended to be conveyed by the United States mail. Included within this correspondence and mail were items containing gift cards and coupons. On several occasions, Novak took out store coupons and gift cards from mail, and used them to buy personal items for himself.

The investigation was conducted by the Office of the Inspector General, United States Postal Service.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Dennis R. Holmes. A pre-sentence investigation was ordered, and a sentencing date has not yet been set.

The defendant was released on bond pending sentencing.
