### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

Agricultural futures retreated Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery dropped 7.5 cents to \$4.715 a bushel; July corn fell 10 cents to \$3.63 a bushel; July soybeans tumbled 11 cents to \$9.535 a bushel; and July oats dropped 2.25 cents to \$1.9575 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef and pork prices dropped on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle fell 2.32 cents to 93.25 cents a pound; August feeder cattle dropped 2.10 cent to \$1.1297 a pound; June lean hogs shed 1.05 cents to 83.55 cents a pound; and May pork bellies lost 1.75 cents to \$1.0325 a pound.

## Entrepreneur Program Seeks Two New Pilot Sites

Dakota Rising, a program of South Dakota Rural Enterprise, stimulates and supports entrepreneurship development through its Rural Entrepreneur Fellows program and supporting activities in four pilot sites located in different corners of the state. Two new Dakota Rising pilot sites will be selected in 2010, the final year of a three year demonstration period.

"The ability to tap into resources and offer our small businesses the tools and money to grow makes Dakota Rising very attractive for rural communities," said Scott Amundson, one of the pilot site coordinators. "We are small, but we have creative, passionate business men and women who need a strong network and connections to be successful. Dakota Rising provides those elements."

To be considered as a Dakota Rising Site you must either be 1) an organization or coalition of organizations that serves a specific geographic area; or 2) a membership organization or an organization that provides services to a well-defined population serving rural people. Dakota Rising Sites:

- Join a learning network dedicated to entrepreneur development.
- Access systems to develop sustainable community networks to support entrepreneurship.
- Receive training in entrepreneur development strategies.
- Connect entrepreneurs to resources and technical assistance.
- Bring Fellowship opportunities to community entrepreneurs.

The first step to becoming a Dakota Rising pilot Site is to submit an "Intent to Apply" on the Dakota Rising Web site, www.dakotarising.com. The deadline for submitting completed Site applications is June 18.

After the completion of the demonstration project in 2011, it is the intention of South Dakota Rural Enterprise to make Dakota Rising available statewide.

### In honor of Mike Larson,

the Emergency Room Staff of Avera Sacred Heart Hospital would like to repeat the reading from his 2009 Memorial Service.

Those of us who worked with Mike knew that he loved a lot of things...  
he loved his family...  
he loved his faith community...  
he loved his God...  
He was passionate about emergency medicine and inspired us to deliver the best of care...  
Mike liked a few jalapeno peppers in his salsa!  
And he loved the great outdoors ...  
hunting with Andrew...  
fishing with his friends ...  
and like a lot of us, he loved the Missouri River ...  
and if you picture the river in your mind for a moment, you might see a flock of geese overhead ...

And that brings us to the five examples of the Wisdom of the Flying Geese that we'd like to share ... wisdom that we think Mike would be honored to have attributed to him in his leadership role in the Emergency Department.

The Wisdom goes like this...

1. As each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird following it.
2. Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to fly alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front.
3. When the lead goose gets tired, it falls back into the formation and another goose flies at the point position.
4. The geese in formation honk from behind to encourage those in front to keep up their speed.
5. When a goose gets sick or wounded, two geese drop out of the formation and follow it down to help and protect it. They stay with it until it gets better or dies. Then they launch out and join another flock or catch up with their formation.

The wisdom story ends with ...  
If we have as much sense as geese, we too will stand by each other in difficult times as well as when we are strong ... this is a difficult time.

But like the geese, we will stay in formation and support one another and stand by each other as Mike would want us to do.

And in the spring ... and in the autumn ...  
when we hear wings overhead  
we will look to the sky  
and we will pause  
and we will remember,  
we will gratefully remember him.
