MILITARY

JOHN C. WIRTH

Army Sgt. 1st Class John C. Wirth has returned to Fort Richardson, Anchorage, Alaska after being deployed to Afghanistan for one year. The soldier is one of 3,500 members of the 4th Airborne Brigade Combat Team (Airborne), 25th Infantry Division stationed at Fort Richardson. Airborne combat team members included soldiers assigned to one of six battalions and regiments of the 25th Infantry Division.

The airborne brigade served in three eastern provinces of Afghanistan, which included the Paktya, Paktika and Khost. Some of the challenges the brigade soldiers faced included poverty, unemployment, security, and management of natural resources and government institutions. Soldiers improved roads, provided vocational training in construction and civics, improved and re-opened 29 schools, remodeled six medical clinics and improved three district courthouses.

While deployed in Afghanistan, he was decorated with the Army Commendation Medal and the Bronze Star Medal.

Wirth, a scout platoon sergeant, is normally assigned to the 1st Battalion, 501st Parachute Infantry Regiment. He has served in the military for nine years.

He is the son of Marla F. Wirth of Vermillion.

Schools Receive Fruit, Vegetable Grants

Yankton and area schools are sharing in more than \$1.2 million through the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP). The grants are awarded to school districts and other agencies across the state by the South Dakota Department of Education's Child and Adult Nutrition Services (CANS).

The participating elementary schools for 2010-11, and their number of students, include Andes Central with 231, Armour 69, Gayville-Volin 124, Marty Indian School 72, Tripp-Delmont 126, Wagner 244 and Yankton's Lincoln Elementary with 392 students and Webster Elementary with 182.

Through another U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)-funded grant, Andes Central was selected as one of six rural school systems sharing \$58,252 in one-time money for purchasing new food-service equipment. The six schools will use the funds to upgrade their kitchen facilities.

"The two grant programs will provide stu-

dents with more opportunities to eat healthy foods during the school day," said Janelle Peterson, who oversees both grants for CANS. "We are pleased to be able to secure these funds for some schools with the highest needs."

The FFVP provides funds to elementary schools for the purchase of fruits and vegetables. The snacks must be served to students at meals other than schools' breakfast or lunch meals. Schools with at least half of their students eligible for free or reduced-price meals receive funding priority.

Eighty elementary schools in 51 districts will get the grants for the 2010-2011 school year; 35 sites will receive the special funding for the first time. More than 18,000 students will receive fresh fruits and vegetable snacks through the program.

USDA's Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program provides elementary students with fresh fruits and vegetables throughout the school day. The

number of children participating in the program varies each year. The program is geared toward elementary schools with the highest proportion of free and reduced lunch enrollment. Total enrollment of all schools selected in the state must result in a per-student allocation of \$50 to \$75.

Administered at the state level by Child & Adult Nutrition Services — the same agency that administers the National School Lunch Program — the FFVP began in 2004.

Legislation in 2008 expanded the program to schools not previously authorized to participate in the program. The program is administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and schools apply through a competitive grant process that is administered by the state Child and Adult Nutrition Services office.
