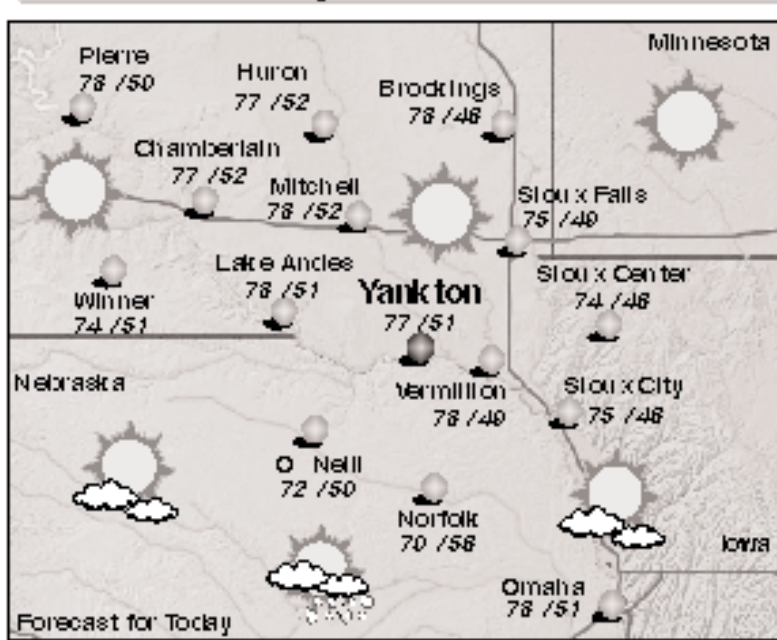

A call to alert the nation's defenses underlined the sober reaction in Congress today to the collapse of summit conference where the Big Four was attempting talks.

was making a peace speech before the United Nations during his visit to this country.
