the years. She was the first woman schoolbus driver for the Tripp School, which she did for three years. Mary enjoyed spending time outdoors, and she and Ray went fishing anytime they could. She enjoyed attending her children's and grandchildren's activities. Mary will be remembered as a loving wife, mother and grandmother. They were members of the United Methodist Church in Tripp for many years until its recent closing, when they became members of Frieden's Reformed Church. Due to failing health, Mary became a resident at the Good Samaritan Society of Tripp in January of 2009, and it is there that she passed away on Friday, May 14, 2010, having attained the age of 72 years, 5 months and 2 days.

USD Med School Ranks Well In Rural Care

VERMILLION — The Sanford School of Medicine of The University of South Dakota is one of the top schools in the country in producing rural physicians.

A study that examined the training of the rural physician workforce in the United States found USD's medical school ranked fourth nationally with 31 percent of its graduates practicing in rural areas. West Virginia University ranked first with 41 percent. The study tracked medical school graduates from 1988 to 1997 who were rural physicians in 2005.

"This study shows how seriously we take our mission of encouraging our graduates to serve in rural South Dakota," said Rodney R. Parry, vice president of health affairs and medical school dean. "We know the need for health care is critical in rural South Dakota."

The study is published in the April issue of Academic Medicine, the journal of the Association of American Medical Colleges.

but I tell you, it is going to be very difficult if the Legislature doesn't start responding to the need for increased aid — very difficult."

The official hearing of the budget was set for the July 16 school board meeting.

Also during Monday's meeting, Gertsema announced that assistant high school principal Wally Bosch has been named the district's new activities director. Bosch will replace longtime activities director Bob Winter, who announced his retirement earlier this spring.

"We had more than 30 people who either applied or inquired about the position," Gertsema said. "We interviewed seven people and we came down to Bosch. We feel he will do a great job. Mr. Bosch has been with the district for more than 20 years, has experience as an AD in a smaller district and has coached a variety of sports. He is very attuned to the fine arts, as well, so we believe he is going to do very well in the position."

Gertsema also announced that high school math teacher Jennifer Johnke, who will complete her specialists' degree in education administration this summer, has been promoted to assistant principal at the high school.

"Mrs. Johnke is a very highly educated, well regarded math teacher at the high school who we think — because of her good teaching background and the way she works with both students and parents — is going to do a great job in the position of the assistant principal," Gertsema said. Other business covered during

the meeting included:
• a report from middle school principal Kathy Wagner, as head of the strategic planning goal committee, on increasing programming to meet the needs of at-risk students at the middle school;

"This committee is well aware of the budget and projected budget, so we looked at what we can do with what we have more on a formal approach," she said. "Because our summer school is more of a consequence than a recovery, we don't have the opportunity to recreate that whole class."

She said that by defining an at-risk student — a student who is in need of academic support and may need additional assistance to promote appropriate emotional and behavioral growth — the committee has started the steps to addressing the issues faced by the students.

• accepting a donation for Stewart Elementary from the Stewart PTA;

"The Stewart PTA and the students of Stewart Elementary raised enough money to purchase a play structure for the main playground and an ADA swing for the play area north of the new addition," Gertsema said. "It is an amazing feat and something to be very proud of."

The next scheduled school board meeting will be held at RTEC at 5:30 p.m. June 21.
