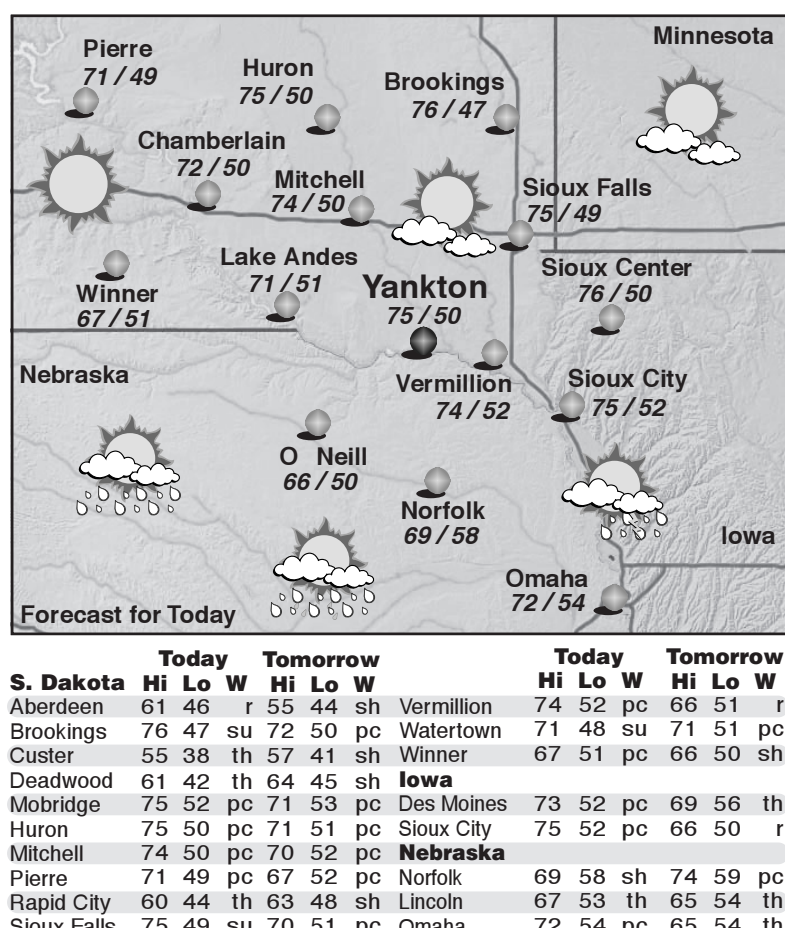

June live cattle edged up 0.25 cent to 92.75 cents a pound; August feeder cattle added 0.52 cent to \$1.1257 a pound; June lean hogs slipped 0.2 cent to 81.3 cents a pound; and July pork bellies climbed 1.2 cents to 99.75 cents a pound.

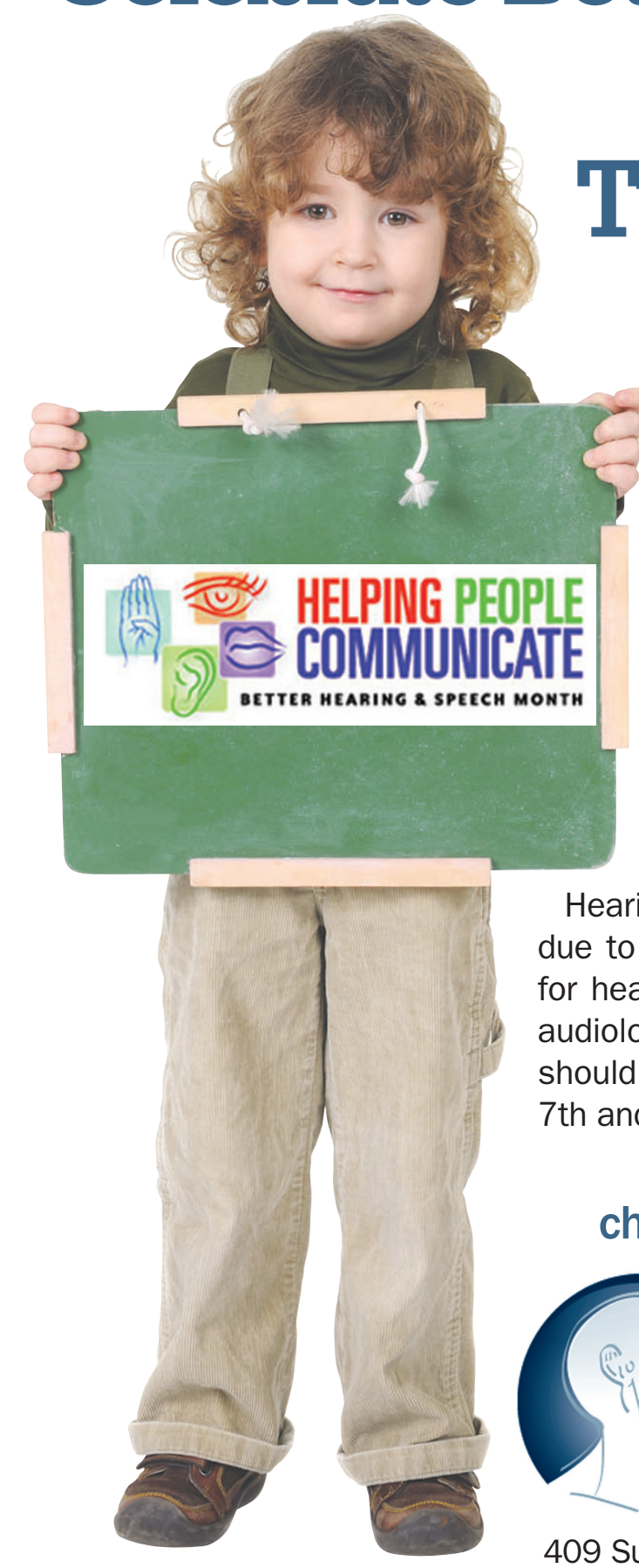
