SDSU Soccer Adds Two Goalkeepers

BROOKINGS — Lang Wedemeyer and the South Dakota State soccer program announced the addition of two goalkeepers to the roster for the 2010 season. They are Kathryn Donovan and Elisa Stamatakis. Donovan comes to SDSU as a transfer from Shoreline Community College in Shoreline, Wash. She led the Dolphins in shutouts in 2008 with 11 while allowing only 10 goals in league and postseason play. In 2009, she recorded three shutouts. Donovan was an all-conference performer earning NWAAC All-Star accolades in 2008 and 2009. Stamatakis, from Edmonton, Alberta joins sophomore Stéphanie Bérubé as the second Canadian product to join the Jackrabbit soccer team. Stamatakis was a member of the Canada National Training Centre from 2006-2010. In 2009, she was a member of the Alberta Canada Summer Games team, leading them to a fourth-place finish. The Jacks posted a 13-7-2 record last season and earned their second straight Summit League regular season co-championship, sharing the title with IUPUI and NDSU.

O'Brien Joins 2010 USF Women's Basketball Recruiting Class

SIoux FALLS — University of Sioux Falls head women's basketball coach Travis Traphagen announced Wednesday the signing of Baileigh O'Brien, an All-American transfer from Iowa Central Community College in Fort Dodge, Iowa. O'Brien, a 6-0 forward, was named a National Junior College Athletic Association All-American last season after averaging 12.5 points, 6.7 rebounds, 4.2 assists and 2.3 blocks per game for the 2009-2010 season. She led ICC to a 28-6 record in 2009 while playing all five positions for the Triton. During her career she has been named all-region twice and selected as the Iowa Community College Athletic Conference Player of the Week twice. O'Brien saw the Triton to a 55-11 record during her two years at ICC, scoring 748 points with 388 rebounds, 214 assists, 124 blocks and 86 steals.

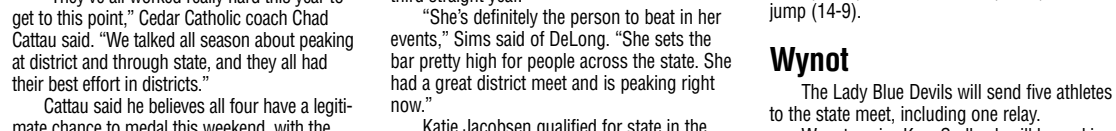
