3 Accused Of Stealing From Santee Sioux

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — Three people have been indicted on unrelated federal charges of stealing money from the Santee Sioux Tribe in northeast Nebraska. A release from the U.S. Attorney's Office in Omaha shows 51-year-old Karen Red Owl, 41-year-old Duane Whipple and 36-year-old Bianco White, all of Niobrara, were indicted Tuesday. Red Owl and Whipple each face a count of embezzlement. White faces one charge of theft. Jan Sharp of the U.S. Attorney's Office says a single investigation led to indictments against Red Owl and Whipple, both tribal employees. Sharp says their alleged crimes are not related. White is accused of stealing more than \$1,000 from slot machines at the tribe's Ohiya Casino in Niobrara.

we've got a missing person," Howe said. "We are doing what we can to find out if it is her. An autopsy is planned for tomorrow (Friday). That is the earliest we will learn whether or not the body they found is Barbara Zenk."

Zenk was last seen Friday, March 5, at approximately 5 p.m. She did not report for scheduled work shifts the following Saturday or Monday. Her vehicle was found unattended and contained her purse, cell phone and keys.

Zenk's vehicle was recovered on the South Dakota-Nebraska state line. The vehicle was parked on the shoulder of the northbound lane of the Vermillion-Newcastle bridge crossing the Missouri River. Zenk is believed to be suffering from depression, according to the missing-person bulletin. Clay County officials and other authorities have maintained a search since Zenk's disappearance, Howe said. The search has focused mainly on the river and the area surrounding her abandoned vehicle. Howe speculated at first that Zenk could be in the Missouri River and have remained under the ice until its thaw. However, he has also remained open to the possibility that Zenk was alive and had left the area. Clay County authorities continue to monitor the area, Howe said.

"We do a visual sweep of the area daily, with no luck," he said. "We haven't had any calls about the missing person for some time, since the first week or two of her disappearance."

It's not unusual for a body to travel far or remain in a river for an extended period of time, Howe said.

"It's completely dependent on the current, obstructions in the river and the water temperatures," he said.

Each drowning case is different, Howe said.

"There are no hard and fast rules," he said. "You can't assume where you will find someone or how they will be found."

The autopsy of the Dakota Dunes remains should help resolve the woman's identity and confirm whether she is Zenk, Howe said.

"All indications are that there is no reason to believe it's anyone else," the sheriff said. "But we'll see what we need to do if they determine it's not her."

GRAINS FUTURES TRADE MIXED ON THE CHICAGO BOT

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mixed Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery inched up 0.5 cent to \$4.6975 a bushel, while July corn climbed 2.75 cents to \$3.62 a bushel and soybeans for July delivery rose 5.5 cents to \$9.44 a bushel. July oats lost 1.25 cents to \$1.94 a bushel. Meanwhile, beef and pork futures traded lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle fell 0.97 cent to \$1.45 cents a pound; August feeder cattle slid 2.15 cents to \$1.1042 a pound; June lean hogs dropped 1.77 cents to 80.25 cents a pound; and July pork bellies shed 1.45 cents to 99.5 cents a pound.
