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Recycling Campaign Gets Local Donation

Parks Advisory Board Member, Craig Sommer, is spearheading a campaign to get recycle containers in the parks. Phase one, paid for with the donation from Payless Shoes, includes the installation of six bins near the Memorial Park pool and picnic shelter.

Phase two will expand the recycling containers into the ballparks and other local city parks.

Currently Nick Shade and his Boy Scout Troop along with Mike Freeman and the Yankton Area Ice Association will be handling the aluminum can collections from the recycle containers as part of their fundraising efforts. This is such a great way for organizations to work together

and support each other while contributing so positively to the environment and to energy conservation.

Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for 3 hours or burn a light bulb for 4 hours—that is a savings that will really impact future generations!

Mr. Sommer hopes to get the support and investment of other area businesses and organizations to sponsor these recycle containers and make phase two successful. In an effort to encourage recycling in general, the Parks Advisory Board, HSC and Shur-co are all working together on a project to place 50 gallon drums with lids in all city parks.
