VERMILLION — The Sanford School of Medicine of The University of South Dakota presented its 2010 Distinguished Alumni Award to a leader on bioterrorism prevention, patient safety and medical education.

Wendell Hoffman, M.D., a 1979 graduate of the School of Medicine, is a specialist in infectious disease and the patient safety officer at Sanford USD Medical Center. After receiving both his undergraduate and medical degree from USD, he completed his residency training in internal medicine as well as a fellowship in infectious disease at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine. Hoffman, a clinical associate professor of internal medicine, has been part of the medical school's faculty since 1987.

As a renowned expert on infectious diseases, his leadership has made the medical community and the state better prepared to handle pandemics. He received the South Dakota State Medical Association's Community Service Award for his work on bioterrorism prevention. In addition to his state medical association award, Hoffman was named Doctor of the Year at Sanford USD Medical Center in 2007.

Hoffman works tirelessly on patient safety. His passion for innovation in this area includes his work as an educator. "His contribution to our school is invaluable," noted Rodney R. Parry, vice president for health affairs and medical school dean. "As a clinical professor, he continually strives to ensure that our medical students keep pace with the latest trends in the patient safety movement."

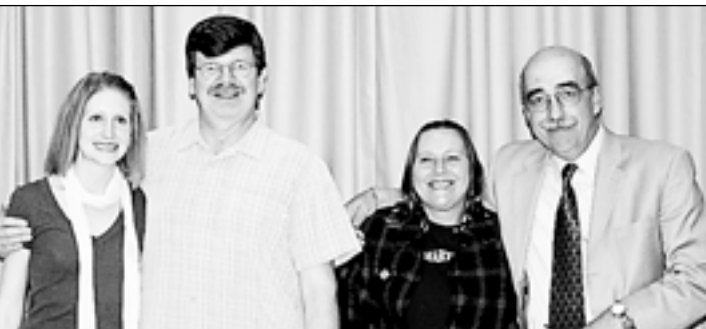

USD Honors Arts And Sciences Faculty With 2010 Cutler Awards

VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota will recognize recipients of its prestigious Richard and Sharon Cutler Faculty Awards in Liberal Arts at USD's Spring Commencement on Saturday, May 8. Endowed by Richard and Sharon Cutler of Sioux Falls, S.D., the awards recognize distinguished faculty in the College of Arts and Sciences.

From the Humanities Division, Scott Breuninger, Ph.D., was honored for his teaching skills in the areas of European history along with his research and specific interest in Britain and Ireland. Recently promoted to associate professor of history, Breuninger has a book coming out that explores the role of Bishop George Berkeley in highlighting virtue and religion as solutions to the social and economic threats facing Britain and Ireland. He received his bachelor's degree from Bucknell University, and a master's and his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin.

Eric Jepsen, Ph.D., is the 2010 honoree from the Social Science Division. Jepsen, an assistant professor, teaches international relations and comparative politics, with particular interests in both Latin America and India/South Asia. He has taught eight different courses in the past three years, and he also led a student group on a trip to Costa Rica. Additionally, Jepsen mentors honors students, serves on several University committees and oversees high distinction projects in The U's Honors program. Before joining the faculty at USD, he previously taught at the

bachelor's degree from St. Lawrence University, a master's degree from Montana State University and his Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota.

The three awards, each carrying a \$3,500 cash prize payable through The University of South Dakota Foundation, are presented annually to faculty who advance liberal arts education through teaching and research over a three-year span.

Clinical Psychology Doctoral Receives Accreditation Through 2017 At The U

VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota's doctoral program in clinical psychology was awarded full accreditation for the maximum term given by the American Psychological Association (APA) Commission on Accreditation. The accreditation followed a review of the USD program's self study report, submitted last year, and a three-person team that visited the program last fall.

"The program takes very seriously the opportunity to engage in ongoing self-assessment and continues to institute programmatic changes designed to improve students' competency in the evolving profession, particularly in research and clinical domains," said Dr. Susan Zlotow, director of the APA's Office of Program Consultation and Accreditation. "Overall, program outcome data demonstrate that the vast majority of students are meeting or exceeding thresholds for program goals, objectives and competencies."

The only doctoral program of its kind in South Dakota, the clinical psychology program at USD is recognized nationally for its training emphases in rural community psychology, disaster psychology and diversity. Through its affiliation with the USD Disaster Mental Health Institute, the clinical program is also the first doctoral program in the nation to offer a specialty track in clinical/disaster

psychology and a graduate certificate in disaster mental health. Zlotow and the committee noted these strengths in its evaluation, particularly the program's attention to diversity through recruitment, retention, education and evaluation.

"We are proud of our accomplishments in this area and honored that APA has chosen to highlight these programs," said Dr. Barbara Yutzenka, Ph.D., professor and director of the clinical psychology program. "We are committed to preparing socially responsible clinical psychologists who demonstrate respect for individual and cultural differences in their contributions to the science and practice of psychology."

The program, which includes eight full-time faculty and 17 adjunct faculty and affiliated supervisors, offers graduate training leading to a master's degree and a doctoral degree within the department of psychology. Currently 39 students are enrolled in the clinical psychology program. Since 1972, more than 215 clinical students have received doctorates from the program and are now working in different capacities across the United States.
