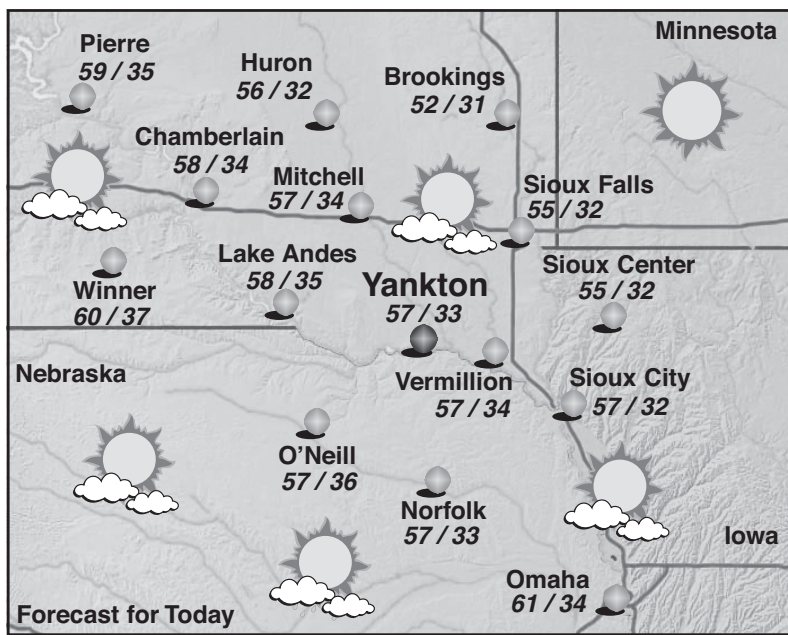

each parish. "We are forever grateful for what they've done," Unzicker said. "They were so willing to open their doors. There was absolutely no hesitation. "The way I look at it, it was like sharing a room with your brother." Through all the Sundays at Our Savior's, there were always dual senses of emotion, according to Mike Swenson, Spring Valley church council vice president. "It would have been awful without Our Savior's," Swenson said. "That last service over

there was bittersweet. We were anxious for our new home, but we were so grateful for what they did for us." Sunday's dedication service, with congregations from both churches, brought 300 people. Kropuenske said the main sanctuary was full, and estimated that 20 additional chairs were brought in, and nearly 50 people were in the adjourning fellowship hall. "It was a very good turnout," he said. "It was neat to see all the different generations come together. Throughout this entire process, we remained united. I think we became stronger because of this." Among the other people in attendance Sunday were the architect of the project and Unzicker's family, as well as Jim Schade rep-

resenting the South Dakota Synod. Unzicker said the theme of "Resurrection From The Rubble" felt right, given the circumstances. Pieces of rubble from the former building were mingled in with flowers on the tables at the open house. "It fit so well," he said. "We've got a new building, and the whole idea of a resurrection fits so well with the Easter season. In a lot of ways it was appropriate." A sign with "Resurrection From The Rubble" was even plastered on a float in the Viborg-Hurley homecoming parade last fall — proof, Swenson declared, of the widespread support. "It's unbelievable all the support we've received," he said. "It's been there from the day of the fire and hasn't let up."

One connection from the previous church to the new building is the bell from the bell tower. The original bell was one of the only pieces of the structure that survived the fire. The bell, which has served the Spring Valley congregation since 1909, will be installed in a new tower that Swenson said should be constructed this summer. As Unzicker talked with parishioners, who enjoyed cookies and punch during the open house, he paused to look at a photo collage near the main doors. Images were included from the previous 14 months, from the fire to the construction phase. "This kind of support was way over anything I ever dreamed of," Unzicker said. "It's such a great feeling to be home again."

sponsored by announcing it was expelling the Libyan ambassador to London. Italy had withdrawn its diplomats weeks ago. Gadhafi's son Seif al-Arab was reportedly killed Saturday by a NATO strike on a Gadhafi compound in Tripoli. Libyan officials denounced the strike as an assassination attempt and a violation of international law. NATO acknowledged it had struck a "command and control building," but insisted all its targets are military in nature and linked to Gadhafi's systematic attacks on the population. "It was not targeted against any individual," NATO spokeswoman Carmen Romero said Sunday, adding the report of the deaths remained unconfirmed.

Federal regulations require anyone applying for a new, renewal or duplicate driver license or identification card to provide the documents listed below (photo copies are not acceptable):

- ONE of the following to prove identity, date of birth, and lawful status: Certified U.S. birth certificate issued by county or state (no hospital birth-certificates); valid unexpired U.S. passport; Certificate of Naturalization; Certificate of Citizenship; valid unexpired permanent resident card; valid unexpired employment authorization document; foreign passport with valid unexpired U.S. Visa with I-94
- If your name is different than the name on your identity document, you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are a certified marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency), a certified adoption document, or a certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree). If you have had multiple marriages, you will need to bring similar documents providing legal proof of each name change. The examiners must be able to trace from your birth name to your current name.
- ONE document to prove your Social Security number: Social Security card, W-2 Form, SSA 1099 Form, Non-SSA 1099 Form, pay stub (must include name and Social Security number). The regulations do not allow personnel to accept any other document as proof of Social Security number.
- TWO documents to prove your residential address. A parent's proof of address is acceptable for a minor child. Bring two of the documents listed here (each must contain your current address): Utility bill, credit card statement, pay stub or earnings statement, rent receipt, phone bill, transcript or report card from accredited school, bank statement, mortgage document, tax document, homeowners/renter's insurance policy. Other items will be reviewed by licensing personnel. PO Box addresses are acceptable in areas not assigned street or 911 addresses. In South Dakota, if you are unable to provide proof of residency, visit www.dps.sd.gov or call 1-800-952-3696.

NOTE: In South Dakota, application must be submitted at least one hour in advance of scheduled closing time. No drive tests will be given from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.
