SIOUX FALLS — Summit's Alex Kneeland, St. Thomas More's Liam Duffy and Winner's Zach Horning were honored as the Mr. and Miss Basketball awards were announced Sunday. During her career, Kneeland scored 2,293 points, collected 421 rebounds, 339 steals and handed out 382 assists. As a senior she averaged 24.2 ppg, pulled down 4 rpg, dished 4.4

and had 2.8 spg. The Augustana recruit broke the State B semi-final scoring record in 2009 with 40 points and the All-Class State tournament scoring record in 2010 with 104 points. Duffy led the Cavaliers to the Class A state title and an 89-9 record for his career, averaging 16.1 points a game as a senior. The Rockhurst recruit was the 2011 Class A 'Spirit of Su'

award winner. Horstman led Winner to a 60-15 record the past three years, averaging 18.2 points per game this past season. The South Dakota State recruit was the team leader in steals, assists, scoring, and drawing charges and second in rebounding.
