CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery fell 9.50 cents to \$7.9175 a bushel; July corn dropped 22 cents to \$7.3450 a bushel; July oats were down 9.50 cents to \$3.43 a bushel; while July soybeans edged down 1 cent to \$13.93 a bushel. Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle fell 1.40 cent to \$1.1195 a pound; August feeder edged down 1.13 cent to \$1.3482 a pound; June lean hogs rose 0.25 cent to 95.47 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.
