ring injuries," he said. "I really enjoyed it." After his medical discharge from the Marine Corps, Irwin returned to Yankton. He then made his second attempt at a college education, enrolling at USD. However, work called again, and he left school to join the Bureau of Indian Affairs at the Yankton Agency in Wagner.

"I was offered a good job and didn't want to pass it up," he said. "I had applied for the police officer position earlier, but it took 14 months to get hired."

For the next 10 years, Irwin worked in law enforcement and often served as acting supervisory police officer and acting chief of police. He was the certified firearms instructor for the agency, and also served as the property and evidence technician.

"The work was very rewarding — lots of nice people," he said.

His injuries continued to bother him, however, and he again had to have surgery in October 2009. Faced with no other option, Irwin retired from the agency for medical reasons in January 2010.

"I was actually selected for a promotion

four food service workers, three administrators, two custodians and one department head. No new retire/rehires have been started since April 1, 2009.

According to the Yankton School District Policy regarding rehiring of a retired employee, a retired former employee may apply for any open position and will be considered with all other qualified candidates. Retiring employees may apply for an open position during their current employment, but no promises, assurances or agreements to rehire the retiring employee may be made prior to the retirement.

Retiring employees who return to work under this policy would be given a one-year contract with no guarantee of continued employment with the district. Sick leave and vacation will accrue as for any other new employee within the classification. However, no sick leave or vacation will carry forward at the time of rehire. The rehired employee shall be offered other benefits just as any other new employee.

years. According to the South Dakota Department of Revenue and Regulation, Yankton had the second-highest first-quarter sales tax revenue increase compared to the same time period in 2010 among the 10 largest cities.

Mitchell saw its expected revenue go up 18.18 percent, according to the Department of Revenue and Regulation. However, Mitchell Finance Officer Marilyn Wilson said that figure is misleading.

In March, when the city posted a 33.59 percent increase in expected sales tax revenue, part of it was due to audit payments to Mitchell that were significantly higher than normal, she said. In other words, a state audit found that sales tax revenue

to lieutenant when I applied for medical retirement from there," he said. "But it just got to be too much. I couldn't handle it anymore."

Irwin once again saw an opportunity for higher learning, and returned to USD through the VA's Vocational Rehabilitation Program. He will be a senior next fall.

After graduation, Irwin plans to attend law school and focus on Indian Law. He hopes to run his own attorney's office one day.

But for now, he's enjoying his newfound time with his wife, Christine, and his two sons, Dawson and Alex. He also spends his free time coaching baseball and flag football, and is an assistant den leader with the Cub Scouts Pack 258 in Yankton.

"I can do a lot more now with my kids than I could when I was a police officer working 12-hour shifts on the weekends," he said.

As one of 80 scholarship winners nationwide, Irwin will travel to Tucson, Ariz., in August to receive his award. During the week-long seminar, he will also have the opportunity to meet with policymakers and community leaders in environmental fields, tribal healthcare and governance.

"I'm really looking forward to it," he said about the event. "I don't think this will all sink in until I'm there."

ate Bill 18 was passed, and it effectively eliminated the possibility of future retire/rehires in a school system, at least as it had been done previously. SB18 provided that retirement benefits would be canceled for any retired member who returns to covered service within three months of retirement. The retiree must repay any benefits received in the period, or accept an offsetting actuarial reduction in eventual retirement benefits.

For those who return to covered employment after three months, retirement benefits would be reduced by 15 percent, and the member forfeits annual increases during the period of re-employment. Employee and employer contributions would be made during the period of re-employment. The employee contributions would be deposited in a deferred contribution retirement account. The employer contributions would be made to the retirement system without any credit to the member, and the member cannot earn additional service credit during the period of re-employment.

that should have been allocated to Mitchell at some point in the past had instead gone to a different municipality.

"Without those (audit payments), we're below what would have been collected the first three months in the prior year," Wilson said.

Vermillion also posted a big increase in the first quarter, coming in at 20.15 percent above 2010. In January and March, expected sales tax revenue was below 2010. However, in February the city had a 74.23 percent increase.

In its monthly reports, the Department of Revenue and Regulation states that some large differences can be explained by amended returns in future months and late filers. Late filers sometimes file more than one return in the same month. There was no indication if that was the case with Vermillion in February.

The biggest revenue loss in the first-quarter compared to 2010 was experienced by Aberdeen, which saw its figure down 7.1 percent.
