Nitrate Levels Too High For Creighton Water

CREIGHTON, Neb. (AP) — The nitrate level in Creighton's municipal water supply is exceeding health standards of 10 milligrams per liter. According to Norfolk radio station WJAG, samples taken Monday tested out at an average of nearly 14 milligrams per liter. The nitrate levels aren't usually a problem for adults and older children, but younger infants can become ill from drinking nitrate-treated water. Federal experts say the major sources of nitrates in drinking water include runoff from fertilizer use; leaching from septic tanks, sewage; and erosion of natural deposits. City Administrator Justin Lilly says city officials are working with state health authorities to correct the problem.

Prison Inmates Assist With Cleanup Projects

PIERRE — State prison inmates recently completed two roadside cleanup projects in connection with the Department of Transportation in southeastern South Dakota. State prison inmates from the Yankton Minimum Unit picked up trash from the ditches along Interstate 29 between the South Dakota and Iowa border and Mile Post 59, the Davis/Hurley exit. Inmates picked up more than 27,000 pounds of debris during the five-day project in April. Inmates from Unit C, the minimum security unit of the Jameson Annex to the South Dakota State Penitentiary in Sioux Falls, assisted the DOT with picking up trash along I-229 near Sioux Falls last month.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery rose 5.50 cents to \$7.5950 a bushel; July corn fell 22.50 cents to \$6.8625 a bushel; July oats rose 5 cents to \$3.39 a bushel; while July soybeans rose 4.25 cents to \$13.26 a bushel. Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle edged up 0.10 cent to \$1.0985 a pound; August feeder cattle rose 1.02 cent to \$1.3277 a pound; June lean hogs fell 0.05 cent to 92.37 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.
