still accessible to the taxing entity." An opt-out, according to South Dakota law, is when a school district (such as in Yankton's case) cannot operate on the revenues generated by the maximum property tax levy for general fund and the money generated from state aid (as determined by the funding formula). If those conditions are met, the school district may "opt out" of the general fund levy limitations. (SDCL 10-12-43) If the opt-out resolution proposed by the Yankton School District passes, the district will be authorized to request up to an additional \$4.175 million per year for the next 10 school years. The school district may request all, some, or none of the opt-out any given year.

For example: During fiscal year July 2011-June 2012 (the first year of the proposed opt-out), the Yankton School Board can request any amount up to \$4.175 million for the year. The following fiscal year (July 2012-June 2013), the district, based on projections, state aid and enrollment data, determines the amount needed to meet the budget. If the Yankton School Board determined it needed only an additional \$1 million (as opposed to \$4.175 million) above the revenues generated by the maximum property tax levy for the general fund and the money generated from state aid, it can request that amount from county auditor Paula Jones, who would

then assess the additional property tax levies. This determination would be done each of the subsequent years until the opt-out expired at the end of fiscal year July 2020-June 2021.

The school district does not need to opt-out again, as long as the district's need does not exceed \$4.175 million above the maximum levies. If the district would need more than the \$4.175 million, it would be forced to pursue an additional opt-out resolution. Yankton School officials have said on several occasions that they were required by law to take the full amount of the opt-out the first year.

However, when contacted by the *Press and Dakotan* Friday, Jason Bietz, business manager for the Yankton School District, acknowledged that the district had mistakenly believed the district would be required to take the full amount the first year of an opt-out.

"I have been so worried about getting all the details right, I just missed this one. I made a mistake," he said, referring to a change in the law since he helped his former employer, the Dakota Valley School District, pursue an opt-out in 2001. "It was never done to mislead anyone. In all honesty, the way the opt-out is structured — where we will only be able to collect half of the amount the first year because of the lag between passing the opt-out and collection of property taxes (Property taxes are collected on a calendar year basis, while the school district runs on a July-June calendar) — the district will almost for sure have to pursue the full opt-out amount the first year no matter if it is required by law or not."
