CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded down Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for July delivery jumped 31 cents to \$7.9050 a bushel; July corn added 21.25 cents to \$7.0750 a bushel; July oats gained 11 cents to \$3.50 a bushel; while July soybeans added 9 cents to \$13.35 a bushel.
Beef and pork futures traded un-

changed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
June live cattle fell 0.85 cent to \$1.0900 a pound; August feeder cattle edged down 0.47 cent to \$1.3230 a pound; June lean hogs gained 0.28 cent to 92.65 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.
