

MMC Nurse Pinning Ceremony Friday

Mount Marty College will hold a Pinning Ceremony for May and December graduating nursing students at 4:30 p.m. Friday, May 13, in Marian Auditorium prior to the Mount Marty College Baccalaureate ceremony.

Established in 1986, Mount Marty's Pinning Ceremony acknowledges the achievement of graduating seniors and their transition from a student role to a professional role. The nurses' pin represents the philosophy of the school and of the nursing program, and its presentation signifies a sending forth or commissioning of the students to begin their nursing careers as graduates of the school.

The nursing pin is unique to the nursing program from which the student graduates. In

years past, a nurse's cap and pin represented the school from which he or she attended. Today, Mount Marty's pin remains as the lone symbol. Typically, each element of the nursing pin represented an aspect of the nurse's dedication.

Mount Marty's pin is a black shield on gold with a white cross embedded on the shield. The modified Benedictine cross represents a crossroads of ideas. The cross also depicts the ultimate aim of the college: to form persons in the Spirit of Christ with apostolic zeal for the world-wide work of restoring all things for Christ.
