### ATHLETICS

The University of Sioux Falls claimed the Great Plains Athletic Conference's All-Sports Trophy for the 2010-11 school year. USF accumulated 171 points, well ahead of Nebraska Wesleyan (155) and Morningside (146). It was USF's final year in the GPAC before beginning the transition to NCAA Division II. ... **The president of North Dakota's Board of Higher Education says the board may consider a legal challenge to a bill that requires the University of North Dakota to keep its Fighting Sioux athletics nickname.** The board met Monday in Bismarck. Board President Jon Backes asked members to think about whether they want to fight the Legislature over the issue. Backes says the question could be taken up as early as June. On Monday the board ordered UND to stop the process of dropping its nickname and an American Indian head logo.

## BASKETBALL

Ralph Sampson III has removed his name from the NBA draft and will return for his senior season at the University of Minnesota. Coach Tuffy Smith says the 7-foot forward entered his name in the draft to "test the waters." ... **Iowa State forward Calvin Godfrey has been dismissed from the team after the school says he was arrested for marijuana possession.** Godfrey averaged 5.7 points and 5.4 rebounds in a promising freshman season in 2010-11.

## FOOTBALL

A federal appeals court will reconsider the case of an Arizona man accused of planning a massacre at the 2008 Super Bowl before changing his mind. Kurt Havelock was convicted in 2008 of mailing threatening messages, but a three-judge panel of the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals overturned the conviction last year. The panel's decision is now void, and the full 11-judge court will consider the conviction anew. ... **The battle to replace Blaine Gabbert as Missouri's starting quarterback is over.** His younger brother, Tyler, has decided to transfer. Coach Gary Pinkel said Monday that redshirt freshman Tyler Gabbert is leaving, ending the competition with sophomore James Franklin to succeed Blaine Gabbert as the Tigers' QB.

One area where Kramer has had to rely solely on his own personal strength is when certain meets run high jump and triple jump simultaneously. Because of that, Kramer, at times, has had to cut down on the number of jumps he makes. "It's tough, especially on meets where they overlap each other," he said. "It's just hard to go from one to the next and expect to do really well. I guess I'm just lucky that I can do well in those." Having to transition mentally and physically between the two events is no easy task, Kalin said. "A lot of times he comes running in from the high jump to triple, or vice versa," he said. "That's a tough combination, but he's able to focus on what he needs to accomplish." The next task will be the 2011 state meet on May 20-21 in Omaha. Kramer said his goal is to win "at least" two events, and medal in all four. "I still have a little bit of work to do, but I'm getting close," he said. Whatever happens at his last
