bate and Diplomacy" (a group exhibit by seniors Hiley Cammock and Stormi Hoebelheinrich); "Failed Diplomacy: The Munich Conference of 1938" (a group performance by juniors Chance Sorenson, Robert Schmidt, Jackson Pasco and Alex McKee); and "King Henry VIII and Rome: the Path of Religious Freedom and the Establishment Clause Rises" (a historical paper by senior Sadie Stevens).

Approximately 35 students began working on projects in October with a research trip to the University of South Dakota. After months of gathering information and working on their entries, the students entered their projects into the district competition in Sioux Falls earlier this spring. Twenty-nine students advanced to the state competition, followed by 10 students qualifying for na-

tionals. In order to advance to the next level of competition, entries must place either first or second in their respective categories.

During that time, the students received assistance from a multitude of sources at USD, including Dr. Kurt Hackemer, Dr. Robert Hilderbrand, Dr. Dan Daily, Dr. Bob Freese and Sam Hurlay.

"I want to thank everyone who has helped us out," Haar said.

Haar added that the students' results would not have been possible without the help of YHS librarian Becky Tasa.

"We are fortunate to have the best librarian in the world in Becky," he said. "She bends over backwards to get the things we need. Behind every successful teacher is a great librarian."

The National History Day Contest will take place June 12-16 at the University of Maryland, with the Smithsonian presentation on June 15.

Haar said a public exhibition in Yankton is planned for the exhibits, but has yet to be scheduled.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded mixed Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery rose 8.25 cents to \$7.9875 a bushel; July corn shed 0.25 cent to \$7.0725 a bushel; July oats gained 2 cents to \$3.52 a bushel; while July soybeans added 3 cents to \$13.38 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures traded higher or flat on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle added 0.17 cent to \$1.0917 a pound; August feeder cattle edged up 0.07 cent to \$1.3237 a pound; June lean hogs gained 0.82 cent to 93.47 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.

ANSWER: According to Yankton County Auditor Paula Jones, there are ag, non-ag, owner occupied and non-owner occupied.

"The ag classification is all rural land that may or may not be in production," she said. "To be qualified ag land there must be a minimum of 20 acres."

Jones said one section of land could at times be classified in two different categories (ag and commercial) if the home is occupied by someone other than the person farming the land and the home on the property is rented out. She also said that, unlike any other property category, the first \$10,000 of the value of accessory buildings is exempt before assessing a property tax value. The additional opt-out levies would be assessed at 63 cents per \$1,000 of property value.

"Anything over \$10,000 is assessable at the ag levy," she said. "Owner-occupied (\$1.98 per \$1,000) is just that, a home where the owner lives in the property."

Jones said that everything else — including apartment complexes, rental houses, restaurants and all retail establishments — is considered commercial property and as such will be assessed at the commercial property rate of \$5.39 per \$1,000 of the property value.

The levy amounts listed have been provided by the Yankton School District and the result of the full amount of the \$4.175 million opt-out being assessed.

QUESTION: Did the Yankton School District award a contract for an addition to the high school/Summit Activities Center at a recent school board meeting?

ANSWER: No. At the April 11 Yankton School Board meeting, the results of two separate bids were released — one for carpet replacement at Lincoln Elementary, Stewart Elementary and Webster Elementary, and one for phase II of the concrete project at the Yankton High School/Summit Activities Center location.

A bid from Yankton's Floor To Ceiling was accepted in the amount of \$18,776 for the carpet replacement. This action was part of the five-year Capital Outlay plan (amended May 2010) and includes carpet replacement in six rooms at Lincoln, three classrooms at Stewart (two because of water damage) and two rooms at Webster where carpet will be glued down, not replaced.

A bid from Masonry Components of Yankton was accepted in the amount of \$216,230 (60 percent school responsibility, 40 percent city responsibility as per the joint-use agreement) for the second phase of a three-phase project repairing and replacing the parking lot at the Yankton High School/Summit Activities Center location.

Phase II, part of a five-year Capital Outlay plan amended in May 2010, includes replacement of a large section of sidewalk in front of the high school entrances; replacement of asphalt drives on the north and west sides of the buildings and back toward the dock area; and adding curb and gutter to the north drive along the tennis courts and track.

Man Pleads Guilty To S.D. Bank Robbery

SIoux FALLS (AP) — An Iowa man pleaded guilty in federal court Tuesday to robbing a bank in southeast South Dakota.

Jeremy Bullock of Inwood, Iowa faces up to 25 years in prison at his Aug. 1 sentencing.

An indictment charged him with displaying a BB handgun to tellers and taking \$7,784 from a bank in Centerville on Jan. 4.

He was arrested a few hours later after a short vehicle pursuit on rural roads.
