he gave for his run was a desire to improve the community's recreational facilities.

"We have a very nice community, but we have some of the poorest facilities in the state," Ellingson read from the profile published when he was 42.

He would go on to be a supporter of the Yankton High School/Summit Activities Center project, as well as a new outdoor aquatic center, which did not materialize.

When thinking about running that first time, Ellingson said he asked for the advice of a veteran public servant, the late Jerry Bienert.

"He's said, 'All you need is some common sense,'" Ellingson recalled.

"Originally, I was probably the only blue collar worker," he continued. "At my first meeting, I looked around and wondered what the hell I was doing there. There were a lot of neckties and businessmen. I just wanted to represent the common Joe. That was my goal."

up, the Yankton County Courthouse and Safety Center was renovated, a new fire station was built, the Discovery Bridge was constructed and the Meridian bridge is being renovated. VanDerhule's recollection of changes to Yankton's landscape goes on and on.

"Thanks to the commitment, entrepreneurial spirit and partnerships between the private and public sectors, and support from the citizens of our community, Yankton has a lot going for it," she said.

VanDerhule said she feels privileged to have served with approximately 18 commissioners and three city managers.

"I really do think what will stay with me the most about serving nine years on the City Commission is the opportunity to be part of multiple community discussions and decisions on projects large and small, from approving licenses to voting on multi-million dollar projects," she stated. "The process would have been a lot harder without engaged and professional city staff and employees who provided background on issues for the Commission, and graciously responded to every question I had. I truly appreciated the opportunity to be involved in city government, and I thank staff and the citizens of Yankton for their support and input during my term. Anyone interested in what goes on in their community should consider running for office. I highly recommend it."

"Even when I disagreed with people, I tried to see their side of it," VanDerhule said.

The importance of listening is part of her advice to current and future commissioners.

"Keep an open mind, but bring your perspective to it," VanDerhule said. "Articulate your opinion in the best way you can. The most important thing is to listen, not only to your fellow commissioners but also members of the community."

Challenges certainly reared their head during those nine years on the commission, she recalled. Disagreements about the need for a new outdoor aquatic center and the firing of City Manager Jeff Weldon were among the most difficult.

"I never felt at any time that (serving on the commission) wasn't worth it," VanDerhule said. "I was glad to be a part of it during the challenging and the good times. I was glad to be a part of it and, to whatever extent I could, facilitate or share things."

Challenges to city government have only grown, she explained.

"Anything now that impacts nationally also eventually impacts locally," VanDerhule said. "They keep pushing things down to the states, and they push it down to the localities. Pretty soon, you run out of room to push any more. I think Yankton does very well. I have great faith in our staff. I think they are doing a great job."

Yankton has weathered changing times well, she stated. That is evidenced by the many positive things the commission was involved with during the last decade. There were expansions at Alcoa, Gehl, Dakota Trailer, and the building of an archery complex and Wal-Mart. Additionally, several downtown sites were cleaned

FDA Clears New Hepatitis C Drug

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Food and Drug Administration on Friday approved a highly anticipated hepatitis C drug from Merck that is the first new treatment for the virus in 20 years.

The first-of-its-kind pill, Victrelis, has been shown to cure more patients in less time than the older drugs now used.

About 3.2 million people in the U.S. have Hepatitis C, a blood-borne disease linked to 12,000 deaths a year.

The current two-drug treatment for the virus cures only about 40 percent of people and

Having sat through commission meetings at least two Mondays a month for 21 years, Ellingson said he is looking forward to nights of being able to come home after work and staying there.

"I'll be able to watch Monday Night Football at home," he stated with a chuckle.
