a new record at 40.79, edging the previous record of 40.80 set in 2002. It is the fastest time in the state of South Dakota history.

Kerswill won the men's 100 meters at 10.50, with Burrus taking third at 10.66, Kovash fourth at 10.78 and Clement fifth at 10.82. Kerswill ran a time of 10.46 in the prelims on Friday, which was the second-fastest time in school history.

Erickson won a highly-competitive women's 1,500 meters, edging Seattle's Sarah Bolce by .47 seconds for the win with a time of 4:37.32. Erickson later defended her title in the women's 800 meters with a time of 2:14.57, winning the race by more than two seconds.

Owens had an outstanding performance in the pole vault with an effort of 16-8 3/4, crushing his previous personal-best by more than eight inches. Owens won the event in 2009 as well.

Duling rolled to the win in the women's 400 meters, capturing the event with a personal-best time of 54.52. Wolter captured the

women's triple jump with an effort of 39-4 for her first outdoor championship. South Dakota's 4 x 100 women's relay was second at 47.28. That consisted of junior Christina Roberts, freshman Monique Williams, junior Ashlea Johnson (Yankton) and sophomore Gabriel Williams.

Freshman Travis Brenner (Yankton) was fourth in the men's 1,500 meters at 3:57.96 and sophomore Jordan Smith (Yankton) was fifth in the men's 110-meter hurdles at 14.825.

Utah Valley wasn't willing to give up and during the bottom of the fourth, Mandy Tapia started off with a double. Tapia advanced to third after a dropped pitch and

was brought home on a single by Amanda Perez. At the end of the fourth inning, the Wolverines had cut the lead to five.

Neither team was able to get their offenses hot in the final three innings, each allowing only one walk but striking out the rest. HBU's defense made some tough plays, as second-baseman Mac Christensen made a leaping catch and ran down a foul ball for two outs in the bottom of the sixth. The Huskies would finish the game winning 7-2.

Hall said after having a long break in between the regular season and the conference tournament, she was a little worried how the weekend would turnout.

"We played real well the last three weeks (of the regular season) and then we were off ten days for finals so we didn't really see any pitching besides our own, which made us a little nervous about not playing games for ten days," Hall said. "I'll admit our practice was not the best on Saturday so, we

told them they got it all out of their system and they really played well today.

Weidert earned the win the Huskies, pitching all seven innings. She finished with three hits, two runs and one error. After replacing Flanary in the top of the fourth, Josi Summers took the loss for the Wolverines, allowing no hits and no runs. Flanary allowed eight hits, seven runs and had five errors.

Hall gave credit to Weidert's pitching and the team's consistency for the wins today.

Looking ahead to today's championship game, Hall said having prior experience with both teams will be a benefit.

"The four teams in our conference are very even — you could play the tournament next weekend and the same team might not win," Hall said. "We're all very competitive, good teams, but it just depends on who plays how on any given day. Today was our day and we're going to hope that tomorrow is, too."
