teriorating roads. Both gravel and asphalt roads are worsening because of standing water and increased truck traffic, he said. "We thought it was a good time to put in the tax, given the kind of shape the roads are in," he said. "It's also the same day that the state changes its (license) fees."

The current roads weren't built to withstand modern traffic, Pesek said. "These roads were built for Model-T's and Model-A's," he said.

Bon Homme County's wheel tax ordinance will now be published in the May 24 editions of the county's legal newspapers: the Avon Clarion, Springfield Times, Tyndall Tribune & Register and the Scotland Journal. The wheel tax becomes law 20 days after the ordinance's legal publication, unless the ordinance is referred to the ballot, Brunken said.

Bon Homme County is the only county in southeast South Dakota without a wheel tax, according to the South Dakota Department of Revenue. Douglas, Charles Mix, Clay, Union and Yankton have \$4 wheel taxes. Turner County has a combination of \$2 and \$4 wheel taxes. Hutchinson County has a \$3 wheel tax.

Bon Homme County first passed a wheel-tax resolution in October 1986, with the ordinance going into effect in January 1987. The wheel tax was referred to the ballot and was overturned by voters. The wheel tax has been under discussion for some time, and now seems the right time for bringing back the tax, Pesek said. "The road conditions are terrible. They need something," he said.
