'Cosmic Math' Workshop Slated For Brookings

BROOKINGS — A five-day workshop at South Dakota State University will equip teachers to explore the connections between math and the sciences in their high school or middle school classrooms. The Cosmic Math 2011 Summer Institute will take place on the South Dakota State University campus in Brookings from June 27-July 1. Teams of math and science teachers in middle and high school are encouraged to apply, but this is not required. Meals and housing are provided, as is a stipend. Interested teachers can find more information or register online at <http://Cosmic-Math2011.questionpro.com>. Cosmic Math is a joint project between the physics and mathematics and statistics departments at SDSU. Project coordinators include Larry Browning and Judy Vondruska in physics and Christine Larson in mathematics.

"The focus is to try to use science — astronomy, specifically, but also physics — to really get students excited about math and understanding the connections between science and mathematics. It gives math and science teachers an opportunity to come together and talk about the connections between their disciplines," said SDSU mathematics professor Christine Larson. A grant of just under \$50,000 from the South Dakota Board of Regents funds the project, which is open to 20 teacher participants. Up to three hours of graduate credit is available in math or physics to participants. SDSU will begin notifying applicants of acceptance on May 25 and will continue until 20 teachers have been accepted. "Cosmic Math 2011 is designed to use astronomy as a means of motivating students to learn geometry, algebra, trigonometry, earth and

physical science concepts," SDSU physics professor Larry Browning said. The project is one of seven the Board of Regents is funding through Title II funds from the U.S. Department of Education. All the projects are aimed at strengthening math and science instruction at the middle school and high school levels. SDSU's partner in the summer project is the McIntosh School District, though teachers from other districts are welcome to apply. "Astronomy is of great interest to students and is therefore an excellent way to expose students to physical science and mathematical concepts," SDSU physics instructor Judy Vondruska said. SDSU faculty will follow up with participants afterward to give additional support and see how the techniques discussed in Cosmic Math 2011 are working in the classroom.
