Missouri National Rec. River Celebrates 20 Years

May 24th marks the 20th anniversary of the addition of the upper 39-Mile District as part of the National Park System's Missouri National Recreational River. This section of our nation's longest river was designated a recreational river through a 1991 amendment to the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act of 1968 to preserve and protect its "outstandingly remarkable scenic, recreational, geologic, fish and wildlife, historic, [and] cultural...values...for the benefit and enjoyment of present and future generations."

This reach is one of the last remaining un-channelized, free-flowing sections of the Missouri River that still retains some of its natural characteristics. Under the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act there are three different

designations — wild, scenic, and recreational — based on the degree to which they have been impounded or altered by humans, the amount of development along their shorelines, and how accessible the rivers are by road, rail, or trail.

The name refers to the 39 miles of the mainstem Missouri River from just below Fort Randall Dam to Running Water, South Dakota. However, it is a bit of a misnomer because that district actually encompasses a total of 65 river miles. It also includes the last 6 miles of Verdigré Creek to its confluence with the lower Niobrara River and the last 20 miles of the Niobrara River to its confluence with the Missouri. Before 1991, the Missouri National Recreational River only contained the 59-Mile reach from Yankton, South Dakota to Ponca State Park in Nebraska.

"The 39-Mile District represents the best of what the Missouri River can offer —

sweeping vistas, outstanding recreational opportunities, and high quality habitat for fish and wildlife.

The National Park Service is dedicated to working with our partners and local landowners to protect and enhance the outstandingly remarkable values that Congress identified 20 years ago which are just as remarkable today," says Superintendent Steve Mietz.

This same amendment to the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act also created Niobrara National Scenic River, another National Park Service unit, headquartered in Valentine, Neb.
