CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures fell Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
 Wheat for July delivery fell 3.50 cents to \$8.03 a bushel; July corn fell 5.50 cents to \$7.54 a bushel; July oats fell 3 cents to \$3.61 a bushel; while July soybeans dropped 6.50 cents to \$13.7375 a bushel.  
 Beef and pork futures traded lower or flat on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
 August live cattle shed 3 cents to \$1.0410 a pound; August feeder cattle slid 3 cents to \$1.2275 a pound; July lean hogs fell 3 cents to 89.32 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.

"It was overnight that the entire school found out that Brandon was diagnosed," he said. "It wasn't a week later, a month later, it was the next day. I came back and everyone was asking me, 'Are you OK, how's it going, is Brandon OK?'"

The total amount donated is "just about \$530," he added. "You have no idea how far that'll go," he said. "We go to and from Sioux Falls every day for months on end, and spend how much on gas. Everybody knows how high gas prices are right now ..."

"I just want to thank the entire senior class and everybody in the entire Vermillion High School," he said.

Three People Hurt In Knox County Accident Saturday

CREIGHTON, Neb. — A three-vehicle crash in Knox County involving a Knox County patrol car sent three people to the hospital with injuries.

The crash occurred around 8:40 p.m. Saturday at the intersection of Highways 14 and 59 west of Creighton, Neb. A westbound Knox County patrol car driven by Deputy Sheriff Dale Robertson, 57, of Center was responding with lights and siren to a one vehicle roll-over accident at or by the intersection of 519 Ave and 875 Road. When Robertson's patrol car entered the intersection, a southbound car driven by 72-year-old Norman Tillema of Mesa, Ariz., struck it.

Robertson's car then rotated and struck an SUV stopped at the intersection, driven by 75-year-old Don Goedecker of Creighton.

Robertson was taken to Avera Creighton Hospital, in Creighton, then transported to Faith Regional Health Services, in Norfolk, by LifeNet Helicopter, in stable condition. Tillema and his passenger, 62-year-old Brenda Watson of Ewing, Neb., were also taken to Avera Creighton Hospital, where Tillema was treated and released while Watson was transported to Creighton Medical Center, in Omaha, with broken ribs and a shoulder injury. Goedecker was not injured.

The accident was investigated by the Nebraska State Patrol. Fire and rescue units from both Creighton and Verdigris, Neb. responded to the scene. Creighton Police Department and the Antelope County Sheriff's Office also assisted in directing traffic.
