BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures fell Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery fell 23.25 cents to \$7.7975 a bushel; July corn fell 20.75 cents to \$7.3325 a bushel; July oats shed 1 cent to \$3.60 a bushel; while July soybeans dropped 1.50 cent to \$13.7225 a bushel. Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle shed 0.20 cent to \$1.0390 a pound; August feeder cattle edged up 0.02 cent to \$1.2277 a pound; July lean hogs fell 2.40 cents to 86.92 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.
