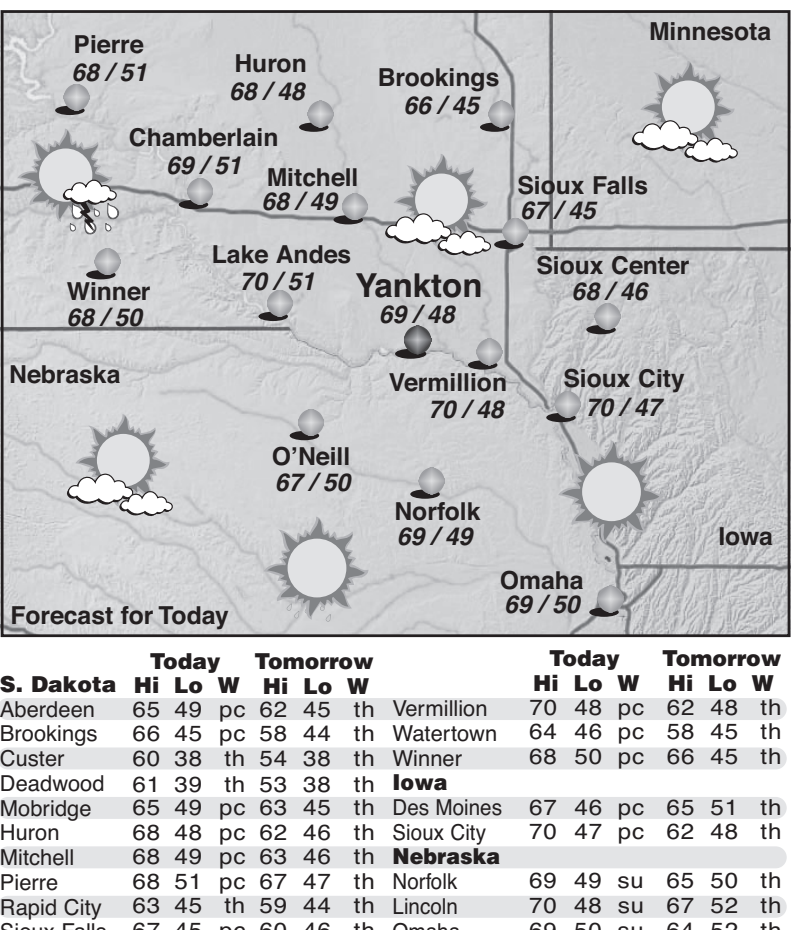

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures fell Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery gained 16.75 cents to \$7.9650 a bushel; July corn added 9 cents to \$7.4225 a bushel; July oats rose 9 cents to \$3.69 a bushel; while July soybeans gained 4.75 cents to \$13.77 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures rose or remained flat on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle rose 1.32 cent to \$1.0522 a pound; August feeder cattle gained 1.75 cent to \$1.2452 a pound; July lean hogs added 0.48 cents to \$7.40 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.
