Joplin Victims Are Offered Existing Homes

JOPLIN, Mo. (AP) — Some of the people left homeless by the Joplin tornado could be placed in rental homes nearly an hour's drive away, and the Federal Emergency Management Agency said Monday it will consider bringing in trailers, as it did for New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina, if enough homes are not available.

FEMA's first option for housing the thousands of displaced is to find them existing rental housing within a 55-mile radius of Joplin, because there isn't much housing left in the city of nearly 50,000 residents that was left badly damaged by the May 22 tornado, spokeswoman Susie Stonner told The Associated Press. Nearly a third of the city was damaged by the violent storm that left killed more than 130 people. Twenty-nine people remained unaccounted for Monday.

Stonner said that despite the distance, putting people in permanent housing is preferable to trailers — especially in an area prone to tornadoes and severe weather.

"Wouldn't you prefer to be in a stable building over a mobile home?" she asked. Stonner also noted that getting things like water, sewer lines and developing pads for trailers would take substantial time.

City Administrator Mark Rohr said the goal is to keep people as close to home as possible but that "based on the circumstances we'll have to respond accordingly." The city has not said how many people were left homeless by the twister, but Rohr said 4,500 to 5,000 residents have registered with FEMA.

"Let us commit ourselves to renew our commitment to the values and ideas that have made this nation what it is today — the greatest nation in the world," he added.

Monday's program was sponsored by the Ernest Bowyer Post 791 and its auxiliary, Roy Anderson Post American Legion and its auxiliary, D.A.V., Hevle Heimes Post and its auxiliary, and the W.R.C.

Musical performances at the event included singing by Hannah Lambertz and the Sacred Heart School's second graders.

Sgt. 1st Class Brooks Schild, the unit public affairs officer for Charlie Battery, had been set to be the featured speaker of the event. However, he was among 55 local guardsmen called by Gov. Dennis Daugaard Thursday night to fight flooding in the Pierre-Fort Pierre area.

Commander-elect of Post 791, Rich Wright, said prior to Gibson's speech that Schild had sent his apologies for not being able to make it to Monday's ceremony. Gibson subsequently agreed to take Schild's place.

"Being the VFW, we have lots of heroes we can call on in a pinch," Wright said.

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Panetta To Take Over At Pentagon
Push For Cuts Tops Replacement's Agenda

WASHINGTON — President Barack Obama's choice of expert budget-cutter Leon Panetta to lead the Defense Department is a clear signal that the White House perceives the nation's deficit crisis, not the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, as its toughest challenge.

After winning the presidency in November 2008, Obama asked Robert Gates to remain defense secretary as the administration struggled to bring clarity to the first of two wars. In tapping Panetta to replace Gates, Obama is turning to a Washington insider and veteran of budget fights as the administration wrestles with reeling in an estimated \$1.6 trillion deficit.

Panetta and the White House have moved to trim defense spending with the budget for the current fiscal year set at \$513 billion.

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
