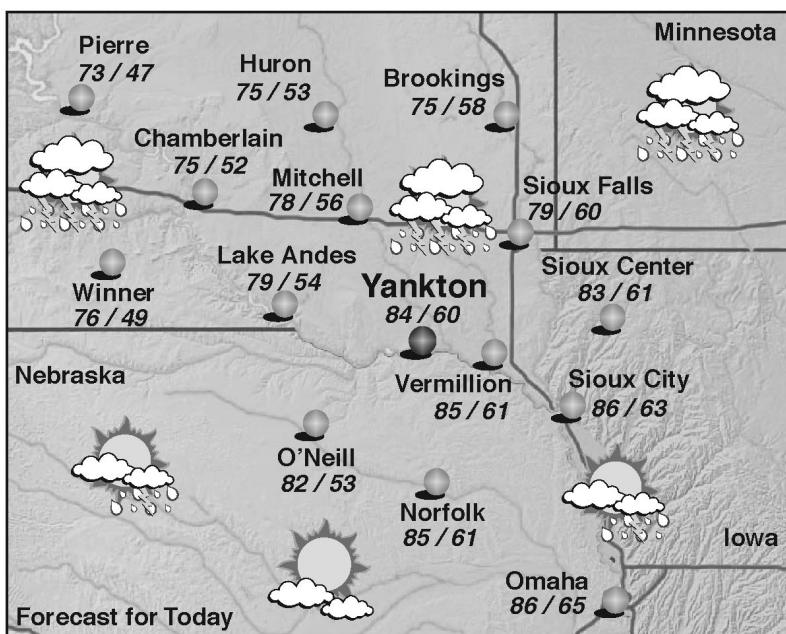

Federal regulations require anyone applying for a new, renewal or duplicate driver license or identification card to provide the documents listed below (photo copies are not acceptable):

- ONE of the following to prove identity, date of birth, and lawful status: Certified U.S. birth certificate issued by county or state (no hospital birth-certificates); valid unexpired U.S. passport; Certificate of Naturalization; Certificate of Citizenship; valid unexpired permanent resident card; valid unexpired employment authorization document; foreign passport with valid unexpired U.S. Visa with I-94

If your name is different than the name on your identity document, you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are a certified marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency), a certified adoption document, or a certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree). If you have had multiple marriages, you will need to bring similar documents providing legal proof of each name change. The examiners must be able to trace from your birth name to your current name.

- ONE document to prove your Social Security number: Social Security card, W-2 Form, SSA 1099 Form, Non-SSA 1099 Form, pay stub (must include name and Social Security number). The regulations do not allow personnel to accept any other document as proof of Social Security number.

- TWO documents to prove your residential address. A parent's proof of address is acceptable for a minor child. Bring two of the documents listed here (each must contain your current address): Utility bill, credit card statement, pay stub or earnings statement, rent report, phone bill, transcript or report card from accredited school, bank statement, mortgage document, tax document, homeowners/renter's insurance policy. Other items will be reviewed by licensing personnel. PO Box addresses are acceptable in areas not assigned street or 911 addresses. In South Dakota, if you are unable to provide proof of residency, visit www.dps.sd.gov or call 1-800-952-3696.

NOTE: In South Dakota, application must be submitted at least one hour in advance of scheduled closing time. No drive tests will be given from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.

City Encourages Cleanup of Inoperable Vehicles

The City of Yankton is kicking off an effort to help citizens eliminate unwanted vehicles and other metals from their property. The city has partnered with local metal recyclers to provide citizens information about recycling scrap metals and inoperable vehicles. Keeping abandoned, unlicensed, dismantled, or inoperable vehicles and other scrap metal violates the City of Yankton's Code of Ordinances. Calls about abandoned or inoperable motor vehicles and scrap metals are one of the most common citizen complaints the city receives.

The Community Development Department staff see this as a great opportunity to provide a resource to citizens who want to do the right thing and clean up their property rather than be subject to a compliance order process.

"We'd like to help connect citizens who don't know what to do with unwanted vehicles on their property with the recyclers who want them," Brad Bies, City Code Enforcement Official said. "Scrap metal is valuable right now, so this is a win-win for property owners and recyclers."

City staff will be providing contact information about the private recyclers in the community who will work directly with the property owners to schedule vehicle removal. Most recyclers accept vehicles at no cost to the owner and many will even pick up the vehicle from the owner's property. The value of a vehicle's scrap metal varies, but it's not uncommon for the recycler to pay the owner for the unwanted vehicle.

Yard Compost Available At Transfer Station

Compost made from grass clippings, leaves and other yard material is available to local gardeners at the Yankton transfer station located at 23rd and Kellen Gross Drive.

The compost is loaded into containers and vehicles by those getting the material. The compost is considered a soil conditioner and the proper use of the compost is the responsibility of those receiving the material. The compost has not been tested for chemical content.

The transfer station is open 8 a.m.-3:45 p.m. Monday through Saturday. There is no charge for the material.
