number of local elections, she said. Activity has already surpassed the 110 early ballots cast in the 2008 presidential primary

election.

"As far as early balloting, we have more than I thought I would. As of right now, we are still getting some calls," she said. "We have a number of people from the nursing homes who want to vote with early ballots."

Tuesday's primary election reflects redistricting of the seven-member board of county supervisors based on 2010 census figures, Fischer said. Six districts changed boundaries, but polling places didn't change.

• In District 2, Republican incumbent Rayder Swanson faces primary challenger Orvil W. Holz. The district represents the Niobrara area in the northwest part of the county.

• In District 4, Republican incumbent Jerry Hanefeldt faces primary challenger Jim Sokol Jr. The districts represents the central part of the county, including the Center, Bazile Mills and Winnetoon areas.

Voters in the Creighton and Plainview school districts will pare down their field of school board candidates.

• Creighton school patrons will choose up to three candidates from among Daniel J. Morrill, Greg Wortman, Jody Fuchtman, Erik Burns, Stacy L. Homan, Justin Lilly and Gene Suhr. The top six candidates advance to the general election.

• Plainview school patrons will choose up to three candidates from among Lucy Christiansen, Bob Green, Mike Sauser, John C. Anderson, Jon Haase, Vicki K. Peterson and Gale Retzlaff. The top six candidates advance to the general election.

Special elections will also be held Tuesday for Nebraska voters.

• Creighton voters will fill a vacancy on the City Council for an at-large term ending December 2014. Leonard A. Clarkson has filed as the only candidate.

The election was created because of the two other changes on the council, Fischer said.

"The former mayor resigned, and the president of the council moved to the mayor's position," she said. "According to the state constitution, the council had two options. It could ask for applications and appoint someone to fill the vacancy, or the council could put it on the ballot, which is what they did."

In another special election issue, Creighton voters will decide whether to reallocate their 1 percent sales tax with 40 percent for the general fund and 20 percent each for the pool, streets and water funds.

In two other elections, voters will also decide money issues.

Bloomfield voters will decide whether to administer the city's economic development program as currently established, appropriating a maximum of \$40,000 annually for 10 years from the local option

sales tax revenues.
Creighton Township
voters will decide whether
to approve a special property-tax levy not exceeding
20 cents per \$100 of taxable valuation until fiscal
year 2016-17. The money
would be used for general
operations, road maintenance and increasing the
restricted funds base.
