75 YEARS AGO
Saturday, May 15, 1937
• An eccentric little old man, who died here April 17, at the age of 83 years, left an estate of more than \$35,000, according to court records, although he lived in seeming poverty.
• After an overnight rain, the day dawned bright and calm to set the stage for the annual South Dakota intercollegiate track and field carnival on Crane field as the title-defending Yankton college Greyhounds and competitors from seven other colleges began the battle for honors here this morning.

50 YEARS AGO
Tuesday, May 15, 1962
• Sidney W. Gurney was elected Yankton's mayor, replacing Milford Vanderhule, at the Monday evening meeting of the city commission. Vanderhule retired from the commission after six years as a member, including one year as mayor, and Commissioner Dudley P. Dewell retired after completing one three year term on the commission.
• The stage is set for "Operation Co-operation" this Thursday, May 17, when students of Yankton and Mount Marty colleges rally their forces for a general clean-up of four city parks, set up playground equipment, plant trees and shrubs, paint fire hydrants and perform a host of other projects.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded mixed Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for July delivery rose 1.25 cent to \$5.9825 a bushel; July corn rose 2 cents to \$5.83 a bushel; July oats fell 3.50 cents to \$3.2850 a bushel; while July soybeans dropped 19 cents to \$13.87 a bushel.
Beef and pork futures also were mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
June live cattle rose 1 cent to \$1.1615 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 0.27 cent to \$1.5720 a pound; while June lean hogs rose 0.07 cent to 85.37 cents a pound.

Manufacturing Academy Slated For Yankton's RTEC In June

Black Hills State University (BHSU) is one of several sponsors with the Regional Technical Education Center (RTEC) to present the annual two-week Manufacturing Academy in Yankton designed to help high school students advance their welding and machining skills, as well as introduce them to career opportunities in the manufacturing field.
This year's Manufacturing Academy will be held at Yankton's RTEC June 4-8 and June 11-15. Participants will spend their first week exploring careers and completing classroom and lab activities. They will also have the opportunity to see manufacturing at its best as they tour several local facilities. During the second week, students will gain hands-on knowledge and apply what they have learned as they complete internship experiences at RTEC or with participating manufacturers.
In addition to gaining new skills, students who successfully complete the two-week academy have the opportunity to earn one-half credit toward their high school graduation requirements, if their school board approves. New this year is the opportunity for students to earn one college credit from Black Hills State University. That credit can also be articulated at Mitchell Technical Institute.
A total of 86 students have successfully completed RTEC's academy since its creation in 2007. It is open to all high school students interested in manufacturing. There is no cost to attend, thanks to generous support from BHSU and other partners, which include Yankton area manufacturers, First Dakota National Bank, Mitchell Technical Institute and the South Dakota National Guard.

Residents Reminded Of Lawn Care

Lawns are greening up, and the hum of lawnmowers can be heard all around the Yankton community. Overgrown grass and weeds aren't just unsightly; they're a violation of city ordinance.
Yankton residents are reminded that grass should be maintained at 8 inches or lower and yards free of noxious weeds. Weeds must be cut or chemically treated. Dandelions are not considered a noxious weed, so while they may be "obnoxious," they are not "noxious."
