Abdnor was a four-term congressman when he defeated the 1972 Democratic presidential nominee as Mc-Govern tried to win his fourth Senate term in 1980. Abdnor claimed that the liberal McGovern was out of touch with South Dakota - saying he couldn't even produce a state driver's license when he applied for a

Abdnor wound up receiving nearly 60 percent of the vote, part of the Republican wave that swept Ronald Rea-

The highlight of his career, Abdnor said, was serving on the Senate Appropriations Committee because it helped South Dakota get attention even though the state had only one House member to help

"You'd be surprised how these agencies like to talk to people that handle money that might affect them,' Abdnor told The Associated Press in 1993. "When you're a small state like South Dakota, it's the only committee as far as I'm concerned when you only have two or three people representing

Abdnor survived a bruising Republican primary challenge while seeking reelection in 1986 by then-Gov. William Janklow, who called Abdnor a weak candidate and cited his lack of speaking skills. The senator embraced the criticism with humor, saying in a television ad: "So I'm not a great speaker. Heck, I'm not a great dancer either, but I'm a great fighter for South Dakota.

But he was defeated in the general election by then-U.S. Rep. Tom Daschle, who went on to serve three terms in the Senate before narrowly losing in 2004 to former Rep. John Thune, who considered Abdnor his mentor. Thune, an assistant to Abdnor during his Senate days, credited him for his own interest in politics.

When Abdnor lost his Senate seat, Reagan appointed him head of the U.S. Small Business Administration and he held the post for

City to a retirement facility in Sioux Falls in 2003, but spent winters in Fort Myers, Fla., where he played golf and went to spring training baseball games. He moved to assisted living in late 2010. He was born in 1923, the
